THE following congratulatory Address was presented to His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, at Government House, Sydney, on 20th August, 1846.

To His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY :—

WE, the President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Members of Committee of the Sydney Mechanics' School of Arts, beg to offer to your Excellency our respectful congratulations upon the occasion of your Excellency's accession to the Government of this Colony.

The Sydney Mechanics' School of Arts was established in the year 1832, under the auspices of Sir Richard Bourke. The objects contemplated in its formation were the diffusion of useful knowledge, by means of lectures and familiar demonstrations on subjects connected with natural and experimental science;—classes for mutual instruction;—a library, a museum, and a reading room. Though professing, as its name implies, to communicate these advantages to the artisans of Sydney, its influence has been found to be of a much more comprehensive character, as it has included amongst its members since its first establishment a large number of persons of various callings, together with a considerable proportion of the youth of the Colonial Metropolis.

We believe that the public voice will support the assertion that the School of Arts has exercised no inconsiderable influence in improving the mental habits and tastes of its members; and as a necessary consequence of this, it has tended in a proportionate degree, to promote their social and moral improvement.

Your Excellency's predecessors, Sir Richard Bourke and Sir George Gipps, were pleased to manifest their approval of the character and objects of this Institution, by filling successively the office of its Patron.

We solicit most respectfully a similar mark of condescension on the part of your Excellency, and therefore beg that your Excellency may be pleased to afford the Institution the distinguished sanction of your name and high position, by assuming the honorary office of its Patron.
