THE following congratulatory Address was presented to His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, at Government House, Sydney, on the 24th August, 1846.

To His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

We, the undersigned, the President, Vice-Presidents, and Members of the Australian Clerks' Provident Society, approach your Excellency with our congratulations on your arrival in this Colony, and to assure you of our devoted attachment to Her Majesty's sacred person, and to your Excellency, as Her Majesty's representative.

We hail with pleasure the many philanthropic acts which have already characterised your Excellency as a liberal and enlightened Governor, and we do not doubt that all public institutions will flourish under your Excellency's benign influence.

We would most respectfully represent to your Excellency, that our Society has for its object the improvement of the condition of that class of the community from which its members are taken, by holding out advantages to those, who, by saving a little of their present means, will thereby secure to themselves provision in the time of sickness or distress, and for their families after their death.

The necessity for such a Society was painfully apparent during the late commercial crisis in this Colony, when extensive failures were daily taking place, and a considerable reduction was made in the respective departments of the Government, by which means great numbers of clerks were thrown out of employment, and reduced to much distress.

We feel assured your Excellency will approve of our desire to provide against recurrence of such evils. Our efforts have met with the approbation of the most influential persons in the Colony, many of whom have become honorary members of our Society, and we humbly trust that your Excellency will further aid our endeavours by becoming its Patron.

In conclusion, we sincerely hope that your Excellency will always enjoy the confidence of all classes of Her Majesty's subjects in this Colony—that your Excellency's labours may be lightened by having to govern a loyal, happy, and contented people, and that not the least amongst your enjoyments will be the proud satisfaction that you have aided, by your countenance, all institutions which profess to improve the social, moral, and religious condition of the inhabitants of New South Wales.
