THE following congratulatory Address to His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, from the Mayor, Aldermen, and Councillors of Melbourne, forwarded by His Honor the Superintendent of Port Phillip, was received by His Excellency on the 29th August, 1846.

To His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY; Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY,

WE, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Councillors of the Town of Melbourne, beg leave very respectfully to offer our congratulations to your Excellency upon the assumption of the Government of this important Colony, and the arrival of your Excellency and Lady Fitz Roy in health and safety after your protracted voyage.

We avail ourselves of the present occasion to assure your Excellency of the firm and ardent loyalty of the inhabitants of this distant portion of the British Empire towards Her Most Gracious Majesty, and we trust that an early opportunity will be afforded them of testifying the same to your Excellency in person as Her Majesty's representative.

We trust that by an early visit to this Province, your Excellency will be satisfied of the extensive commercial and agricultural resources of Port Phillip—of the enterprise, energy, and wealth of its population—and of the necessity which exists for extending the fostering hand of Government in the promotion of various public undertakings which their present position so justly claims.

We fervently pray, that under a gracious providence, your Excellency may long fulfil the high duties with which Our Gracious Sovereign has invested you with honor to the Office, and benefit to the people over whom you are called upon to rule; and that every happiness may attend your Excellency and your Excellency's honorable Consort.

GENTLEMEN:

I beg to return you my sincere thanks for the honor you have conferred upon me in forwarding to me an Address of congratulation on my assumption of this Government.

Deeply impressed with the importance of the charge which our Most Gracious Sovereign has been pleased to commit to my care, I hail with pleasure your assurance of the loyalty of the inhabitants of so influential a portion of my Government.

And I can assure you, that in performing the interesting duty of making myself personally acquainted with the wants and resources of all parts of the Colony, I shall attend to those of the District of Port Phillip at as early a period as may be in my power after the close of the approaching Session of the Legislative Council.

TICKET OF LEAVE REGULATIONS.

(TRANSFER OF TICKETS.)

IT appearing to the GOVERNOR, that some misapprehension exists with respect to the meaning of the 10th clause of the Ticket of Leave Regulations of the 25th May, 1835, which directs "That all applications for the transfer of a Ticket of Leave from one District to another, or for permission to reside without the bounds of the District for which the Ticket is granted, must be made to the Principal Superintendent of Convicts through the Petty Sessions of the District for which the Ticket already held is granted, or through the nearest Justice, as the case may be;" His Excellency desires it to be explained, that the object of requiring such applications to be transmitted through the Bench of the District was not (as has apparently in some cases been assumed) to enable the Magistrates to regulate the supply of labour in their Districts, but to establish a proper discipline and control over the Convicts, and to prevent such of them as may have laid themselves open to suspicion from changing their Districts, in order to evade a surveillance, which a knowledge of their character may have rendered necessary; whilst it was always intended that well conducted men should select for themselves any of the rural Districts where they thought

they were most likely to obtain profitable employment.

When, therefore, applications for the transfer of Tickets of Leave are received, they should be invariably forwarded to the Principal Superintendent of Convicts, for His Excellency's allowance or disallowance; and should the Bench see reason to object to the transfer, the grounds of their objection should be specifically stated in their report.
