PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by two several Proclamations made and issued by His Excellency Sir George Gipps, with the advice of the Executive Council, the one bearing date the 2nd day of January, 1841, and the other the 23rd day of December, 1842, certain days were appointed for the holding of Circuit Courts at the Towns of Berrima, Maitland and Bathurst respectively; and it has been represented to me the said Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, by their Honors the Judges of the Supreme Court, that it is expedient to alter the times for the holding of those Courts in the manner hereinafter directed: Now, therefore, I, do by this my Proclamation, issued with the advice of the Executive Council, ordain and appoint, that instead of the days so appointed as aforesaid, the said Circuit Courts shall respectively, after the expiration of the present year, be holden as follows, that is to say; at *Berrima*, on the 3rd day of February and the 1st day of September; at *Maitland*, on the 12th day of February and the 10th day of September; and at *Bathurst*, on the 22nd day of February and the 20th day of September. Provided that where any of those days shall happen on a Sunday, the

Court shall be holden at Berrima, Maitland, or Bathurst, as the case may be, on the day next following.

Given under my hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this fifth day of October, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and in the tenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

QUIT RENTS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified, that the following Regulations have been established for the payment and redemption of Quit-rents due upon Lands under Grants from the Crown, namely:—

1st.—All lands for which twenty years' Quit-rent has been already paid shall be free from further charge; and any persons who may have paid more than twenty years' Quit-rent shall have the difference refunded to them.

2nd.—All persons who have not paid up twenty years' Quit-rent, will be required to do so by yearly instalments of the annual amount due in each case,

commencing in this present year; and on the completion of twenty years' payment they will be relieved from all further charge.

3rd.—As an inducement to parties to redeem the Quit-rents due by them according to the terms laid down by this notice, they will be allowed to do so at any time within twelve months from this date, at the number of years purchase specified in the following scale, namely:—

In any case in which the land included in a Grant has been subdivided and conveyed in portions to different proprietors, the Government will not object to entertain proposals for the total extinction of the proportionate amount of Quit-rent due on any such portion, on the principle established by this notice; but, as no rule can be laid down which would be generally applicable to cases of this nature, they must form the subject of special investigation and arrangement in each individual case, it being however understood, that any expense of ascertaining the boundaries of the land on which it is desired so to redeem the Quit-rent, must be borne by the parties interested.

This arrangement will include all Quit-rents, whether for Town Allotments or Portions of Land; and whether the Grant contain any covenant for redemption or not.

THE following description of a grant of land with the name of the person to whom it was originally promised, or by whom it is now claimed, is published for general information, in order that all parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

It is requested that within one month from the present date, the following particulars may be accurately furnished to this office, viz:—

Surname and all Christian names of the person in whose favor the Deed is to be prepared, written at full length, his residence, and the intended name of the property.

If these be duly furnished and satisfactory, and if no Caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty appear, a Deed will be prepared accordingly, as soon as possible after the expiration of the stated period of one month.

If the required particulars be not furnished within that period, or if a Caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty arise which cannot be satisfactorily determined by the Government, the case will be referred to the Commissioners of Claims, and the parties subjected to the expense of that proceeding.
