PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same. &c., &c, &c,

HEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the Reign of her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to "Courts of Requests, and to extend the juris-diction of such Courts in the County of Cum-"berland," it was amongst other things enacted, that from and after the first day of January, 1843, Courts of Requests should be holden in and for such Counties and Districts, or other portions of this Colony and its Dependencies, and at such places respectively, as the Governor should, by Proclamation for that purpose from time to time appoint. And it was further enacted, that Courts should be holden in the County of Cumberland, in which Courts, besides a power and authority to hear and determine in a summary way, all Actions for the recovery of any debt, demand, or damage to an amount not exceeding Ten Pounds; Actions also to the amount of Thirty Pounds, of the nature authorised by the above recited Act, should be heard and determined: Now I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint, tha Courts of Requests, in and for the County of Cumberland, shall be holden during the year 1847, at the times and places, and for the Districts hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say :---

The "Ordinary Sittings" of the Court of Requests for the trial of all cases not exceeding Ten Pounds, shall be holden on the following days respectively, viz:—Monday, 4th January; Monday, 1st February; Monday, 1st March; Monday, 5th April; Monday, 3rd May; Monday, 7th June; Monday, 5th July; Monday, 2nd August; Monday, 6th September; Monday, 4th October; Monday, 1st November, and Monday, 6th December, respectively, at the City of Sydney, for the Police District thereof, as described in a certain Notice from the Colonial Secretary's Office, bearing date the 15th day of September, 1841, and published in the Néw South Wales Government Gazette.

The "New Sittings" of the said Court for the trial of all cases from Ten to Thirty Pounds, shall be holden on the following days respectively, viz.:—On Monday, 8th February; Monday, 12th April; Monday, 14th June; Monday, 9th August; Monday, 11th October; Monday, 13th December, respectively, at the City of Sydney, for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid Notice.

The "Ordinary Sittings" of the Court for the other Districts in the County of Cumberland will commence on the undermentioned dates; and the "New Sittings" of the Court for these Districts respectively, shall commence immediately at the close of the "Ordinary Sittings."

At the Town of Campbelltown for such portions of the Police District thereof as are situated in the County of Cumberland, and for such portions of the Police District of Camden and Narellan as are situated in the County of Cumberland as described in the aforesaid Notice: On Monday, 11th January; Monday, 19th April; Monday, 12th July, and Monday, 18th October respectively. At the Town of Liverpool for the Police District thereof as described in the aforesaid Notice: On Wednesday, 13th January; Wednesday, 21st April; Wednesday, 14th July, and Wednesday, 20th October respectively.

At the Town of Parramatta for the Police District thereof as described in the aforesaid Notice: On Thursday, 14th January; Thursday, 22nd April; Thursday, 15th July, and Thursday, 21st October respectively.

At the Town of Windsor and for such portions of the Police District thereof as are situated in the County of Cumberland, as described in the aforesaid Notice; On Monday, 18th January; Monday, 26th April; Monday, 19th July, and Monday, 25th October, respectively.

At the Town of Penrith and for such portions of the Police District thereof as are situated in the County of Cumberland, as described in the aforesaid Notice: On Thursday, 21st January; Thursday, 29th April; Thursday, 22nd July, and Thursday, 28th October, respectively.
