PUBLIC MONEY.

WITH a view to prevent the recurrence of the inconvenience which has, in some cases, been found to result from Public Monies having been placed in the Banks by persons in the service of Government to their private accounts: his Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that, for the future, no Public Monies shall, on any pretence whatever, be paid to the private account of Officers at the Banks; but that, if transmitted through the Banks at all, they must be carried to a public account, wholly distinct from any private account.

The Census for the County of Bourke.

NOTICE is hereby given, that persons desirous of being appointed Collectors, under the 9th Victoria, No. 21, for taking the Census, are requested to send in their applications for that appointment, on or before Saturday, the 24th instant, directed to the Clerk of the Bench, Melbourne, and superscribed, "Application for Collector, under 9th Victoria,

No. 21." Such parties to state for what portion of the County of Bourke they seek to be appointed.

The Collectors will be furnished with blank schedules, in which the Names, Numbers, and other particulars of the Individuals residing within the District for which they shall be appointed, are to be inserted; and for the performance of the duties of this office, such Collectors will receive ten shillings per diem, or fifteen shillings per diem, if employed with a horse between the 2nd and 16th days of March next, under a penalty of from forty shillings to five pounds.

Boundaries of County of Bourke for this purpose, are as follows, viz. —

Bounded on the south-west and west by the Werriby River, from its mouth to its source, in the Great Dividing Range: on the north by the Great Dividing Range, from the source of the Werriby to that of the Plenty River: on the east by the Plenty River, from its source to its confluence with the Yarra Yarra River; thence upward by that river to the confluence of the Deep Creek; thence by the Deep Creek, upward to the point where the main stream commences to run in a north-westerly direction; thence by a line southerly from the aforesaid bend to Dandenong Creek; thence by the Dandenong Creek, downward, to the shores of the Port Phillip Bay; and on the south by the shores of the Port Phillip Bay to the mouth of the Werriby aforesaid.
