Gaol Regulations.

HIS Excellency the Governor, directs the publication, for general information, of the following alterations in the General Rules for Gaols, dated 27th September, 1841, which have been prepared under the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the Act of the Colonial Legislature, 4 Victoria, No. 29.

AMENDMENTS of clauses I., IV., and VIII., of the Gaol Regulations, of 27th September, 1841, advised by the Executive Council, on the 6th July, 1846.

I. In all cases where the Building will allow of separate classification, the Prisoners are to be divided into four classes.

- (1.) Debtors and others confined for contempt on civil process.
- (2.) Prisoners committed on charges of felony or misdemeanor, or for want of sureties, and Prisoners convicted of misdemeanor including cases of contempt, other than on civil process.
- (3.) Prisoners convicted of felony.
- (4.) Lunatics and persons of unsound mind.

IV. A convenient and suitable apartment shall be set apart and appropriated as an Infirmary for the reception of sick and diseased Prisoners, including persons of unsound mind, who are not dangerously insane; and a separate one for Females.

VIII. Prisoners confined for debt or for contempt on civil process, Prisoners committed for trial, and persons sentenced to imprisonment without being sentenced to hard labour, shall be allowed to procure for themselves, and to receive at proper hours, any food, bedding, clothing, or other necessaries, subject to a strict examination by the Keeper of the Prison, in order to prevent extravagance and improper indulgence within the said prison, or the admission of Fermented or Spirituous Liquors, or other prohibited articles, and all articles of clothing and bedding shall be examined in order that it may be ascertained that such articles are not likely to communicate infection or facilitate escape. Such of the last mentioned persons as do actually maintain themselves, at their own expense, are exempt from the labor authorized by the 9th clause of the Act 4 Vic., No. 29.

By His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS her Majesty has been graciously pleased, by Commission under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the twentieth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, to constitute and appoint me,

Sir CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight, to be Captain-General, and Governor-in-Chief, in and over the Territory called New South Wales, and its Dependencies: Now I, the Captain-General and Governor aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that I have, this day, taken the prescribed Oaths before His Honor Alfred Stephen, Esquire, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the said Territory, and that I have assumed the Administration of the Government accordingly.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare, that Her Majesty has been pleased to nominate and appoint the undermentioned persons to be Members of the Executive Council of the said Territory; that is to say:—

The Senior Officer in command of her Majesty's Land Forces for the time being.
The Bishop of Australia, or the Bishop of Australia for the time being.
The Colonial Secretary of the said Territory, or the Colonial Secretary of the said Territory for the time being; and
The Colonial Treasurer of the said Territory, or the Colonial Treasurer of the said Territory for the time being.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

HIS Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitzroy, Knight, Captain-General, and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, having arrived, and signified his intention of landing at twelve o'clock to-morrow, (Monday), at the Semi-Circular Quay in Sydney Cove, the Governor requests that the Chief Justice, the Members of the Executive Council, the Judges, the Clergy, Magistrates, and Civil Officers, will assemble at that place, to receive his Excellency on his landing, and to follow in procession to Government House, where his Excellency will take the usual oaths.

The way by which his Excellency is to pass, will be lined by the Military, agreeably to a General Order of this date.

As soon as his Excellency lands at the Quay, a salute of nineteen guns will be fired from Fort Phillip Battery, and a second salute of the same number of guns immediately after the Oaths of Office have been administered to his Excellency.

His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitzroy has expressed his intention of immediately afterwards holding a Levee at the Government House, for the purpose of receiving such persons as may be desirous of being presented to his Excellency.

Gentlemen attending the Levee are requested to bring their cards to be delivered to the Aide-de-Camp in waiting.
