WHEREAS the Legislative Council of New South Wales now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said Colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the twentieth day of April next.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this seventeenth day of February, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and in the tenth year of Her Majesty's reign.

REPAIRS TO LIVERPOOL AND CAMPBELLTOWN ROAD.

TENDERS will be received at this Office until 12 o'clock of Monday, the 1st March next, for the undermentioned work.

1. Thoroughly repairing 14 small Bridges, and 17 Cross Drains between the Cross Roads at Harris's and Narellan, via Campbelltown.

2. Removing 2 platform Bridges between Liverpool and Cross Road at Harris's, and laying Corduroy Bridges in their stead, 60 and 40 yards long, and 30 feet wide.

3. Filling the holes and ruts, and putting in proper shape any portions of the Road between Liverpool and Narellan, via Campbelltown, at per mile.

4. Metalling (if required) with Whinstone Metal, (broken so that each fragment will pass lengthwise through a 2½ inch ring,) 20 feet wide, with an average depth of 7½ inches, at per lineal yard,

Persons tendering to specify the length of time they would guarantee the proper repairs of each work, also the time required for the completion of each work.

Case No. 1260.—William Charles Wentworth, of Vaucluse, M.C., by his solicitor Robert Johnson.

Thirteen and one-half perches, in the County of Cumberland, City of Sydney, and parish of St. James, allotment No. 2 of section No. 50; bounded on the west by the building line of Macquarie-street, bearing south three degrees fifteen minutes east fifty-four links; on the south by allotment No. 1, bearing east three degrees thirty minutes north one hundred and eighty-four and a-half links; on the east by allotment No. 4, bearing north three degrees thirty minutes west fifty-four and a quarter links; and on the north by allotment No. 3, bearing west three degrees thirty-nine minutes south one hundred and eighty-four and one-half links.

Under date 24th June, 1839, a Deed of Grant of the above described allotment, was issued in favor of Mrs. Jemima Eager. Mr. Wentworth alleges that it forms part of a lease of fifty-one perches, dated 30th June, 1823, signed by Sir Thomas Brisbane, and in favor of Joseph Buckley who assigned to Jonathan Williams who assigned to him.—That he never parted with his interest—that the term of the lease is now expired—that the legal title is therefore in the Crown, and that he is entitled to a Deed of Grant in his own name.

Case No. 1261.—John Bingle, of Puen Buen, gentleman.

One hundred acres, County of Brisbane, parish of Scone, at Strathearne; bounded on the north by the south boundary of S. Coxen's six hundred and forty acres, being a line bearing east eighty chains; on the east by a line bearing south twelve chains fifty links; on the south by a line bearing west eighty chains; and on the west by a line bearing north to a marked tree at the south-west corner of S. Coxen's six hundred and forty acres as aforesaid. This land was located on an order of Sir Thomas Brisbane, dated 28th October, 1823, in favor of Thomas Jones. Claimant alleges that he is the present proprietor.

Case No. 1262.—Saul Samuel, of Wellington, gentleman, by his Solicitor Parry Long.

One rood, County of Northumberland, parish of Maitland; bounded on the south-west by sixty-seven links of the north-east side of the high road, bearing east forty and one-half degrees south; on the east by a line bearing north twenty-two and one-half degrees east three chains ninety-three links to Spark's south boundary line as fenced; on the north by eighty links of that boundary line bearing west; and on the west by the east boundary line of land claimed by Robins, bearing south twenty and three-quarters degrees west three chains and fifty-nine links to the High Road.

In pursuance of a Report under the first Commission on Memorial No. 767, a Deed of Grant of the land above described, was prepared in favor of Richard Macguiness, dated 20th May, 1837; but he having died in November, 1836, the deed is void. Macguiness, before his death, sold to Charles Robins, under whom Claimant derives his title, and requests a Deed of Grant from the Crown.

Case No. 1263.—James McMeekan, Alexander McMeekan, and Margaret Kelling, at present residing in Scotland, by their Attorney Robert Crawford, of Hillend, gentleman.

Eight hundred acres to be selected.

On the 29th July, 1824, Sir Thomas Brisbane issued an order in favor of William McMeekan, for 800 acres of land, of which he made unsatisfactory selections. On the 4th June, 1828, Governor Darling refused to authorise his receiving the land, unless he settled, and he was referred to the Land Board. In July, 1834, he renewed his selection which was refused. He is now deceased, and his heirs have empowered their Attorney to select the land.
