## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the 7th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act further to amend An Act, intituled, 'An Act for the better preservation of the Ports, Harbours, Havens, Roadsteads, Channels, Navigable Creeks and Rivers in New South Wales, and the better regulation of shipping in the same,'*" it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, from time to time, to frame Rules and Regulations to be observed by the Masters and Commanders of all Ships and Vessels in the Harbour of Port Jackson, and by all persons duly licensed to act as Pilots in the said Harbour, and the said Rules and Regulations, and all Rules and Regulations relating to the said Harbour which may be in force, to alter, amend, or repeal, and substitute others in their stead, as to the said Governor and Executive Council may seem necessary or expedient: Provided that all such Rules and Regulations, or such amended, altered, or new Rules and Regulations, and notice of the Repeal of any such Rules and Regulations shall be promulgated by Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor for the time being of the said Colony, to be published in the New South Wales *Government Gazette*, at

least one month before the same shall take effect, at the expiration of which time the same shall be, and thenceforth continue to be, in full force and effect.

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fifth day of March, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, certain Rules and Regulations were promulgated for the observance of the Masters and Commanders of Ships and Vessels in the Harbour of Port Jackson. And whereas it has become necessary to repeal so much of the said Rules and Regulations as direct that "the Master or person in charge of any Steamer navigating in the Harbour of Port Jackson, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, shall not proceed at more than half speed whilst within Darling Harbour, Sydney Cove, or any other part of the Harbour lying to the eastward of Goat Island, and to the westward of Pinchgut Island; and so long as any steamer shall be under weigh within the Harbour of Port Jackson, between the aforesaid hours, the Master thereof shall keep two lights burning, the one at the mainmast head, and the other at the bow, and shall continue the ringing of a bell, or the sounding of a steam whistle; and any person who shall offend against this Regulation, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds." Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Governor of the said Colony, do by this my Proclamation hereby promulgate the following Regulation which has been framed by me the said Governor, with the advice of the said Executive Council, and is to be observed by the Masters and Commanders of all Steam Vessels in the Harbour of Port Jackson; and I do further notify, that the said Regulation will take effect, and be and become in full force from the expiration of one month from the day of the date hereof, and be substituted for the aforesaid Regulation now in force for the Harbour:

of Port Jackson, in respect to Steam Vessels, which shall be hereby repealed from and after the second day of April next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this second day of March, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and in the tenth year of Her Majesty's reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

**REGULATION TO BE OBSERVED IN THE HARBOUR OF PORT JACKSON, NEW SOUTH WALES.**

[The Masters of Steamers navigating the Harbour of Port Jackson, between sunset and sunrise, to go at half speed, to keep three lights burning, and to sound a bell or steam whistle.]

The Master or person in charge of any Steamer navigating the Harbour of Port Jackson, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, shall not proceed at more than half speed whilst within Darling Harbour, Sydney Cove, or any other part of the Harbour lying to the eastward of Goat Island, and to the westward of Pinchgut Island; and so long as any Steamer shall be under-way within the Harbour of Port Jackson within the aforesaid hours the Master or person in charge thereof shall cause to be continued the ringing of a bell, or the sounding of a steam whistle, and shall keep three lights burning of the following descriptions, that is to say,—a plain light at the fore-mast-head, a plain light on the starboard bow, and a red coloured light on the port bow.—And any Master or other person as aforesaid, who shall fail to observe this Regulation, or shall do anything contrary to the true and plain meaning thereof, will be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds. (here insert the particulars required,) and I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true, and by virtue of the provisions of an Act made and passed in the ninth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for the more effectual abolition of oaths and affirmations taken and made in various Departments of the Government of New South Wales, and to substitute Declarations in lieu thereof, and for the suppression of voluntary and extra-judicial oaths and affidavits.*"

*On the 29th July, 1824, Sir Thomas Brisbane issued an order in favor of William McMeekan, for 800 acres of land, of which he made unsatisfactory selections. On the 4th June, 1828, Governor Darling refused to authorise his receiving the land, unless he settled, and he was referred to the Land Board. In July, 1834, he renewed his selection which was refused. He is now deceased, and his heirs have empowered their Attorney to select the land.*
