

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fifth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to make further " provision for the trial of cases in the Circuit " Courts of New South Wales, and to amend in " certain respects the Act providing for trial by " Jury in such Courts," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor for the time being of the said Colony, by any Proclamation or Proclamations, by him from time to time for that purpose issued, to apportion and divide the said Colony into three or more Circuit Districts, and to ascertain and fix the boundaries and limits of every such District, and such limits and boundaries from time to time to alter as occasion may require; and whereas by a Proclamation under the hand and seal of His Excellency Sir George Gipps, the late Governor of the said Colony, bearing date the second day of January, One thousand eight hundred and forty-one, Circuit Courts for the trial of Criminal as well as Civil Is ues were directed to be holden at \ the Town of Maitiand to the north, at the Town of Berrima to the south, and at the Town of Bathurst to the west, at certain times therein set forth; and whereas by a certain other Proclamation also under the hand and seal of the said late Governor, bearing date the twenty-third day of August, One thousand

eight hundred and forty-one, the said late Governor did in pursuance of the said recited authority, divide the parts of the Colony in the said last mentioned Proclamation specified into three Circuit Districts, to be called respectively the Northern, the Southern, and the Western Districts, and did in and by the said last recited Proclamation proclaim and appoint that the said Southern District should consist of all parts of the said Colony comprehended within the Counties of Camden, Argyle, St. Vincent, Murray, and King, with the exception of such parts of the Counties of Camden and St. Vincent as are comprised within the Police Districts of Picton, Camden and Narellan, Campbelltown, Illawarra, and Broulee; and whereas I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, the Governor for the time being of the said Colony, did by a Proclamation under my hand and seal, bearing date the fourteenth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, direct and appoint that Circuit Courts for the trial of Criminal as well as Civil Issues, shall be holden at the Town of Goulburn, at the times in my said Proclamation mentioned; and whereas the said Town of Goulburn is within the said Southern District, and it is expedient and proper to divide the said "Southern Circuit District," and to create separate Circuit Districts for Berrima and Goulburn, as hereinafter provided: Now therefore, I, the said Governor for the time now being, do, in pursuance of the authority vested in me, divide the said parts of the Colony now included within and known as the said " Southern Circuit District " into two parts, to be called respectively the "Berrima Circuit District" and "Goulburn Circuit District," and I do proclaim that the said "Berrima Circuit District" shall consist of all parts of the said County of Camden as are now comprised within the said "Southern Circuit District" and also all other parts of the said county; and

that the said "Goulburn Circuit District" shall comprise all other parts of the said Colony whereof the ches, allotment No. 16 of section 28. Upset price said "Southern Circuit District" now consists.

DEPASTURING LICENSES AND
ASSESSMENT ON STOCK.

ONSIDERABLE sums being still due to the Government for Depasturing Licenses, and for arrears of Assessment on Stock pastured on Crown Lands beyond the boundaries of location, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be intimated to all persons thus in default, that unless they forthwith pay up all arrears and take out Licenses for the runs they occupy, the Government will be reluctantly compelled to proceed for penalties, and to dispossess them, under the Act of Parliament 9 and 10 Victoria, cap. 104.

And all parties thus in arrear are reminded, that under the proposed Order in Council, the *licensed occupants* of Crown Lands, at the time the same may come into effect, will alone be entitled to demand or obtain without competition leases of their runs.
