SIR,

I have received Sir Maurice O'Connell's Despatch, No. 1, of the 14th of July last, announcing the departure of Sir George Gipps from New South Wales, and his own assumption of the Government, as Senior Commanding Officer, within the Territory.

That Despatch also encloses a copy of the Supplement of the *Government Gazette*, containing the various Addresses presented to the late Governor on his retirement, together with the Answers which he had returned to them.

I have read these Addresses with much pleasure. They not only afford the most unequivocal proof of the high esteem in which the personal character of Sir George Gipps was held by the Colonists, but likewise bear a high and well merited testimony to his distinguished public services, during the time he administered the government of New South Wales.

PUBLIC EDUCATION.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has directed it to be notified, with reference to the Regulations of 24th September, 1841, that pending the establishment of further Regulations respecting Public Education, which it is His Excellency's intention to issue with as little delay as possible, no aid will be allowed from the public funds to any new or additional School which may be established after this date.

It is also to be distinctly understood, that while no sum beyond that which has been especially voted for the purpose by the Legislative Council can be guaranteed to any existing Schools, the Governor, in consequence of the great and rapidly increasing demands upon the Government under the Regulations in question, deems it necessary to announce, for general information, that he cannot undertake to place upon the Estimates any addition to the Expenditure for Schools of this description, beyond the amount for the whole of the present year, calculated in proportion to the payments for the first quarter of the same.

GROSE FARM.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that the Paddocks at Grose Farm, will be put up separately to Auction, for Sale on Lease or License, for one year, commencing 1st August next, at the Colonial Treasury, Sydney, at Eleven o'clock, on Wednesday, the 21st of July, namely:—

Lot 1.—Is estimated to contain eighteen acres, and comprises two paddocks, fenced, with the old Stockade and the garden and yard attached thereto, and is situate on the north-western end of Grose Farm, but excludes the Police Station at the western extremity. Upset price £30.

Lot 2.—Estimated to contain twenty-two and a-half acres, comprises two paddocks fenced, and is situated on the south-west corner of the farm. Upset price £15.

Lot 3.—Estimated to contain twenty-six and a-half acres, comprises two paddocks fenced; it is bounded by a fence dividing it from lots 2, 4, & 5. Upset price £18.

Lot 4.—Estimated to contain seventeen and a-half acres, in one paddock fenced; it is bounded by the Parramatta Road, and divided by a fence from lots 3, 5, & 6, and the road along the creek bounding lot 1; out of this lot will be reserved a road, extending from a slip panel on the Parramatta Road to the creek near the Stockade.
