PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS, in conformity with the provisions of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "*An Act to provide for the making and repairing of Parish Roads in the Colony of New South Wales*," Trustees have been appointed for a road known as the Parish Road leading from the Suburban Allotments in the Parish of Jika Jika, near Melbourne, to the Village Reserve in the Parish of Nillumbik, River Plenty; and the said Trustees have, in accordance with the twenty-first section of such Act, certified that the said Parish Road is in a state to permit and allow the safe and uninterrupted passage of the public with their carriages and other vehicles and horses, and other cattle and stock; and it has further been made to appear, to the satisfaction of the Governor and Executive Council, that a sum exceeding three hundred and fifty pounds sterling has been expended thereon: Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, the Governor of New South Wales aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited Act,

do, by this my Proclamation, appoint and direct Tolls to be demanded, levied, and taken upon the aforesaid Parish Road, leading from the Suburban Allotments in the Parish of Jika Jika, near Melbourne, to the Village Reserve in the Parish of Nillumbik, River Plenty, in the manner prescribed by the before recited Act, and at the rates specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed; and further, that the Tolls so to be collected or levied upon such Parish Road, shall be paid to the Trustees thereof, to be by them laid out, employed, and expended in the making, fencing, and repairing, and in keeping in repair the said road and the bridges thereon, and in keeping in proper repair the toll houses and bars, and in the payment of the Collector of such Toll, and other necessary expenses, of which all parties concerned are hereby required to take due notice.

Given under my hand and seal at Government House, Sydney, this first day of July, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

Provided always, that if any coach, chariot, cart, or other carriage, so tied or affixed to any waggon, dray, or cart, shall have any goods conveyed therein, other than the harness thereto belonging, and such articles of package as may be necessary for the protection of such carriage, or any passenger, the same shall be liable to double the Toll hereby imposed; the above rates of Toll shall be doubled on each and every Sunday.			

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the GOVERNOR and Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "*An Act for the Regulation of Gaols, Prisons, and Houses of Correction, in the Colony of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and for other purposes relating thereto,*" it is enacted, that all Buildings, Erections, Houses, and Premises, which should thereafter be erected, built, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public Gaols, Prisons, and Houses of Correction within the said Colony and its Dependencies, and which should, by Proclamation, to be from time to time published in the New South Wales *Government Gazette*, by order of the Governor for the time being of the said Colony, be declared and notified as such public Gaols, Prisons,

or Houses of Correction, should from and after the publication of such notification, be severally deemed and taken to be the public Gaol, Prison, or House of Correction of the place or District where the same was or should be situated within the said Colony or its Dependencies respectively, and should be subject to the several provisions thereafter made for the regulation, management, care, and discipline of the public Gaols, Prisons, and Houses of Correction belonging to the said Colony and its Dependencies, and of the prisoners confined within the same; and whereas there has been for some time in course of erection, as and for a public Gaol, the building called and known by the name of the New Gaol, at Goulburn, in the said Colony; and it is expedient that the said Gaol should be and be declared to be a public Gaol, Prison, and House of Correction:— Now, therefore, I, the Governor, by virtue of the said recited Act, and in pursuance of the power and authority thereby vested in me, do hereby proclaim, declare, and notify, the said building at Goulburn to be a public Gaol, Prison, and House of Correction,

REWARD OF TEN POUNDS, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that during the night of the 18th or morning of the 19th instant, a mare, the property of the Chief Constable at Dungog, was stabbed in the abdomen, by some evil disposed person or persons unknown, with a knife or some sharp instrument, in consequence of which she died: His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Ten Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the guilty party or parties; and further that if the party giving such information be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.

GROSE FARM.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that the Paddocks at Grose Farm, will be put up separately to Auction, for Sale on Lease or License, for one year, commencing 1st August next, at the Colonial Treasury, Sydney, at Eleven o'clock, on Wednesday, the 21st of July, namely:—

Lot 1.—Is estimated to contain eighteen acres, and comprises two paddocks, fenced, with the old

Stockade and the garden and yard attached thereto, and is situate on the north-western end of Grose Farm, but excludes the Police Station at the western extremity. Upset price £30

Lot 2.—Estimated to contain twenty-two and a-half acres, comprises two paddocks fenced, and is situated on the south-west corner of the farm. Upset price £15.

Lot 3.—Estimated to contain twenty-six and a-half acres, comprises two paddocks fenced; it is bounded by a fence dividing it from lots 2, 4, & 5. Upset price £18.

Lot 4.—Estimated to contain seventeen and a-half acres, in one paddock fenced; it is bounded by the Parramatta Road, and divided by a fence from lots 3, 5, & 6, and the road along the creek bounding lot 1; out of this lot will be reserved a road, extending from a slip panel on the Parramatta Road to the creek near the Stockade. Lot 8.—Estimated to contain six acres, in one paddock fenced; and is situate between the old and new Parramatta Roads; it includes the three roads and two and a-half perches fenced off at the western extremity. Upset price £5.

The purchasers will be required to pay down at the time of sale the amount of one half year's rent in advance, and before allowing possession of the lands or buildings, they must enter into an engagement, with two sureties, for the due payment of the remainder of the rent on the 1st February, 1848, in default of which, the land will be entered on by the Government, and the License or Lease annulled.

REPAIRS TO THE LIVERPOOL AND CAMPBELLTOWN ROAD.

1. Thoroughly repairing fourteen small bridges and seventeen cross drains, between the Cross Roads at Harris' and Narcellan, via Campbelltown.

Corduroy Bridges in their stead, 60 and 40 yards long, and 30 feet wide.
