DEPASTURING LICENSES AND ASSESSMENT ON STOCK.

CONSIDERABLE sums being still due to the Government for Depasturing Licenses, and for arrears of Assessment on Stock pastured on Crown Lands beyond the boundaries of location, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be intimated to all persons thus in default, that unless they forthwith pay up all arrears and take out licenses for the

runs they occupy, the Government will be reluctantly compelled to proceed for penalties, and to dispossess them, under the Act of Parliament 9 and 10 Victoria, cap. 104.

And all parties thus in arrears are reminded, that under the proposed Order in Council, the *licensed occupants* of Crown Lands, at the time the same may come into effect, will alone be entitled to demand or obtain without competition leases of their runs.
