VACCINATION.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has directed the re-publication of the Notice of 11th January, 1847, with a view of drawing the attention of parents and guardians to the importance of Vaccination.

VACCINATION.

His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that a Vaccine Institution has been established in Sydney, and that Dr. Savage, the Health Officer, has been appointed to carry out the objects of the Institution.

His Excellency further directs it to be notified, that Dr. Savage will be in attendance at the Immigration Barracks, Bent-street, between the hours of 10 and 12 o'clock on every Tuesday and Saturday to Vaccinate, free of charge, such children as may be taken to him for the purpose. But as the operation itself, without any proof of its having taken effect, would be insufficient security to the public mind, His Excellency has been pleased to direct, that the sum of one shilling shall be deposited for every child vaccinated, which sum will be returned on the presentation of the child on the next vaccination day.

His Excellency very strongly recommends Parents and Guardians to avail themselves of the means thus afforded to them of taking this necessary and proper precaution with respect to all children not already vaccinated.

In order that a constant supply may be kept up throughout the Colony, the Health Officer will furnish lymph to any Medical Practitioners in the County Districts who may apply for the same.

All communications with that Officer on the subject of Vaccination, sent through the Post Office, must be enclosed under cover to the Colonial Secretary, with the word "Vaccination" on the lower left hand corner of the envelope.

REPAIR OF THE LIVERPOOL ROAD BETWEEN THE EIGHTH AND TWELFTH MILESTONES.

TENDERS will be received at this Office until Monday, the 23rd August next, marked "Tenders for repairing Liverpool Road," from persons willing to contract for reforming and repairing that portion of the Liverpool Road, lying between the 8th and 12th Milestones, in the following manner:—

The portion of Road to be divided into two lots, of two miles each.

The roadway to be formed thirty feet in width, with a curved fall of one foot from the centre to the side drains, or water tables.

The holes and ruts to be filled with the best convenient material.

All stumps or rocks within the thirty feet of roadway to be removed to, at least, eighteen inches below the present surface.

All the bridges and cross-drains to be repaired where required.

All the drains for carrying off the surface water to be cleared out and deepened, and others to be made, where absolutely necessary.

The whole of the work, including bridges, drains, &c., in each lot, to be completed within six months from signing the Bond, and to be kept in repair or three years from the date of the completion of the work, to the satisfaction of the Surveyor General, or the Officer appointed to superintend.

The Contractor or Contractors to assume the whole risk of executing the works, and to acquaint themselves as to the work required to be executed in each lot, as no excuse will be entertained for deviating from the true intent and meaning of this notice.

The Assistant Surveyor of Roads will point out, on the ground, the manner in which the work is to be performed, and will give every information to persons desirous of tendering, on application to him, at the Surveyor General's Office, Sydney, between the hours of eleven and three, on any Friday or Saturday before the day fixed for opening the Tenders.

Payment will be made at the rate of 75 per cent as the work proceeds.
