## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS a certain Bill was passed by the Legislative Council of New South Wales, in the seventh year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "*An Act to give a preferable lien on wool from season to season, and to make mortgages of sheep, cattle, and horses valid, without delivery to the mortgagee,*" which Bill was assented to in Her Majesty's name by the Governor for the time being: And whereas His Excellency the said Governor, did, by the first convenient opportunity, transmit to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State an authentic copy of the said Bill so assented to, which said copy was received by the Right Honorable Lord Stanley, then being one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, on the twenty-second day of July, One thousand eight hundred and forty-four; and whereas Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Act of Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "*An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land,*" and in exercise of the powers reserved to Her Majesty, hath, by an Order bearing date the sixth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, declared Her disallowance of the said Bill: Now, therefore, I, Sir

Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, as such Governor aforesaid, by this my Proclamation, do signify to the said Legislative Council such disallowance, and that I have duly received a certificate under the Hand and Seal of the Right Honorable Earl Grey, now one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, certifying the day on which such Bill was received as aforesaid.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this twenty-sixth day of August, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

FAMILIES OF CONVICTS.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that Her Majesty's Government have determined to revive the practice of forwarding to this Colony, at the public expense, the wives and families of married convicts who have become free by pardon or otherwise, or who have obtained tickets of leave, and who may be recommended by the Governor as worthy of that indulgence.

2. Those persons who have already obtained tickets of leave, or any higher degree of liberty, or whose terms of transportation have expired, and who may be desirous of being joined by their families, will make application in the annexed form, to the Principal Superintendent of Convicts.

3. Every such application must be supported by the recommendation of two or more respectable persons known to the Government, and satisfactory assurance must be afforded that the applicant has the means of supporting his family.

4. In like manner, Convicts at present under sentence will be allowed to apply for the above indulgence, as soon as they have received tickets of leave, but not before.

5. Those persons whose applications were forwarded to the Secretary of State under the regulations of 6th May, 1833, but were not then complied with, will be required to make fresh applications in the accompanying form.
