CLAIMS TO LEASES OF CROWN LAND BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

WESTERN PORT DISTRICT.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, for the information of all persons interested, that in pursuance of Her Majesty's Order in Council, of 9th March, 1847, the under-mentioned persons have demanded Leases of the several Runs of Crown Land particularised in connexion with their respective names.

Persons who object to any of these claims, either wholly or in part, should lodge caveats at this Office within two months from the present date, specifying the Lands to which their objections extend, and the grounds on which their objections are based.

It is to be distinctly understood, that the Government does not pledge itself to the issue of a Lease in any case until due enquiry has been made into the validity of the claim, and whether or not it may be necessary to reserve any portion of the Land claimed for any of the public purposes contemplated in the Order in Council.

No. 1.

Allan Innes Robert.
Name of Run—Balla Balla.
Estimated Area—6,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—400 head of Cattle.

Bounded on the east by Rutherford's run; on the west by Mr. Willoughby; on the north by a creek unnamed; on the south by Mr. Smith's run.

N. B.—This run has been transferred, with the sanction of the Government, to Mr. C. J. Haselwood, in whose name the Lease will accordingly be prepared.

No. 2.

Aitken John C.
Name of Run—Thornton.
Estimated Area—19,200 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,000 head of Cattle.

The run extends for 12 miles on the River Goulburn, which bounds it on the north and east; the Jerusalem Creek is the boundary with Messrs.

Goodman and Chenery up to the Goulburn or about south-east high ranges; the Rubicon and Acheron Creeks form the boundary to south and west, a line of fencing between the Rubicon and Acheron and part of the Rubicon separates the run from Major Davidson; the Acheron, from the fence to its junction with the Goulburn, is the boundary with Mr. Henry Matson.

Name of Run—Picanniny Creek.
Estimated Area—51,840 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the east by Bakewell and Sims' run; on the west by Mr. Mitchell's run; on the north by Open Plains run; on the south by the Picanniny Creek.

No. 4.

Aitken John.
Name of Run—Tandara.
Estimated Area—50,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the east by Whip Tree Scrub; on the south by Myers Creek station; on the west by Bullock Creek station; on the north by Picanniny Creek.

No. 5.

Aitken John.
Name of Run—Myers Creek.
Estimated Area—50,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—3,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north by Tanda run; on the south by D. Campbell's run; on the east by James Mouatt's run; on the west by Bullock Creek run.

No. 6.

Aitken John.
Name of Run—Bullock Creek.
Estimated Area—50,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—3,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north by Mitchell's run; on the south by D. Campbell's run; on the east by Tandara and Myers Creek; on the west by Bullock Creek.

No. 7.

Airey George S., (per George Playne.)
Name of Run—Killingworth, Cheviott Hills.
Estimated Area—50,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—9,000 Sheep.

The run is formed by the junction of the Muddy Creek with the Goulburn River, with frontage to the Goulburn of about 9 miles, frontage to the Muddy Creek, from its junction with the Goulburn, may be estimated at about 10 miles, and from thence the station is bounded by that occupied by Mr. Matson, by a line running south-east along the tops of the ranges which divide the fall of the waters betwixt the Main Chain and Limestone Creeks; the boundaries with the station of E. Cotton to the northward and eastward are by a high tier of ranges, and from a gap in these ranges called the Native Dog Gap, the water falling from this gap, and also all the water falling into the same valley on the Goulburn side, being on the station of Mr. Cotton, and that on the Limestone side to Mr. Airey.

No. 8.

Bampllett William.
Name of Run—Muddy Creek.
Estimated Area—10,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—5,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the front side by Muddy Creek; on the back by a line running 6 miles from east to west, and by a creek and a line running 7 miles north-east and south-west, having the stations of Messrs. Millar and M'Farlane, and Messrs. Hardie, as neighbouring stations; the boundaries having been approved of by Mr. Commissioner Powlett.

No. 9.

Brierty Robert.
Name of Run—Steel's Flat.
Estimated Area—10,240 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—500 head of Cattle.

Scrubby country. Bounded on the east by the Yarra Yarra River; on the north by Mr. Ryrrie and the Yarra River 1 mile; on the west by barren ranges; and on the south by Messrs. Cavanagh and Canavan 3 miles.

No. 10.

Bucknell E. G.
Name of Station—Rodborough Vale.
Estimated Area—23,400 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—9,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the west by Mr. A. M'Callum, by a marked tree line bearing north by east $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles and 10 chains long; from thence by D. C. Simpson, by a ploughed line bearing north-east by north $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles long, crossing the Deep Creek to a marked tall tree on the plain; from thence by a line bearing east by south 4 miles long to a marked tree at the foot of a wooded hill, from thence on the east by Joyce Brothers by a ploughed line bearing south $1\frac{3}{4}$ miles to its junction with the Middle Creek; thence by the Middle Creek bearing south south-west 4 miles long to its junction with Major Mitchell's line, from thence on the south by Captain M'Lachlan and Donald Cameron, by the Major's line bearing south-west by west $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles long to its junction with Mr. M'Callum's boundary line. The run is principally open country, but has one large swamp and two small ones. It is watered by the Deep Creek.

No. 11.

Baxter Benjamin.
Name of Run—Carrup Carrup.
Estimated Area—15,360 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—500 head of Cattle.

Bounded on the west commencing at a point where the Cape Schanck road crosses the swamp or flat about 2 miles eastward of the homestead, and bearing southerly across Duncan's flat about $3\frac{3}{4}$ miles, dividing from Davey's; on the south by Mrs. King, bearing north 7 degrees east about $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles; on the east by King and by Willoby's, bearing north north-west about 5 miles, and by Bryan's and Willoby's on the north-east, bearing across the heath about south 60 degrees west $4\frac{3}{4}$ miles more or less, and thence along the Schanck road southerly about 2 miles to the commencing point.

No. 12.

Buchanan James.
Name of Run—St. Germain.
Estimated Area—5,760 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—300 head of Cattle.

Bounded as follows:—on the east by the Great Swamp; on the south by Messrs. Mantons and Atkinson and Clarke; on the west by Robert Henry; and on the north by Dr. Jamieson.

N. B.—This run has been transferred, with the sanction of the Government, to Mr. Alexander Patterson, in whose name the Lease will accordingly be prepared.

No. 13.

Bett John.
Name of Run—Wharparella.
Estimated Area—76,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—12,000 Sheep.

Commencing at a point of the Murray river bounding with Messrs. Collyer, bearing southerly along a belt of timber for $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and bounded by Messrs. Collyer; thence south-west about 8 miles, bounded by Messrs. Collyer; thence south 4 miles bounded by person unknown, thence north-east 8 miles, bounded by Messrs. J. Aitken and A. Sim; thence north-easterly by belt of timber 7 miles, and bounded by Mr. Sim to the Campaspie river; thence by the Campaspie river southerly to the boundary with Mr. Sim on the east side 2 miles; thence easterly for 5 miles, and bounded by Mr. Sim and Mr. O'Dea; thence northerly to the junction of the Murray and Goulburn $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles, bounded by Mr. O'Dea; and on the north by the Murray river to the commencing point 12 miles.

No. 14.

Boyd J. and J. S.
Name of Run—Wallan Wallan.
Estimated Area—2,700 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—2,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north-east and north north-west with marked trees $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles by Broadhurst and Tootle, on the north 3 miles marked trees by Captain Cain, on the west 1 mile by Brooke, and on the south-west $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles marked trees by Purves. The leading features are a tier of ranges running from Mount Macedon and Steels creek, which runs through the centre of the run.

No. 15.

Baynton Thomas.
Name of Run—Darlington.
Estimated Area—25,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—500 head of Cattle, 12,000 Sheep.

Granite ranges about north-west by Mr. Molison, Mr. Pohlman's ranges north-east Mr. Beauchamp's creek, general course south-east and range south-west; Mr. Piper's ranges south-west; Mr. Peter's ranges north and east; Mr. Simmond's ranges south-west, creek about east marked lines being boundaries.

No. 16.

Beauchamp Robert, (per Henry Barrow.)
Name of Run—Spring Plains.
Estimated Area—20,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,000 head of Cattle, 7,000 Sheep.

Bounded by the Campaspie on the west to the junction of a gully known as the paddock gully with the Campaspie, thence by a range north of the said gully in an easterly direction to the Back Creek below the junction of Briggs Creek and the Back Creek, thence by Briggs Creek running south-east to the high range forming the boundary between the said run and Dr. Baynton, thence the back creek to a tree marked B, forming the boundary between said run and Mr. Pohlman, thence a line nearly west to a bald hill on Pohlman's Creek, thence a line nearly west to the Campaspie.

No. 17.

Beauchamp Robert, (per Henry Barrow.)
Name of Run—Langley Vale.
Estimated Area—9,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—500 head of Cattle, 3,000 Sheep.

The run is bounded on the north by a range running east the division between Messrs. Pohlman and Baynton, thence by a line west to a creek known as Piper's creek forming the boundary on the western side for about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles the division between said run and Mr. Mitchell, thence a line of marked trees running east to a gully known as the Jews Harp gully, dividing with Mr. Piper, thence the aforesaid gully and a line of marked trees running north to a creek known as Mealing's Creek forming the division between said run and Dr. Baynton.

No. 18.

Bailey, Watson, and Wight.
Name of Run—Late Postlethwaites.
Estimated Area—44,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,000 head of Cattle, or 8,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north by the Aboriginal station and thick forest, on the east by the Goulburn river, on the south by a line commencing 1 mile to the northward of the junction of Mitchell's Creek with the Goulburn, and running in south-westerly direction to a chain of hills forming with forest and scrub the western boundary.

No. 19.

Brock John.
Name of Run—Bullanda Vale.
Estimated Area—25,600 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—300 head of Cattle, 12,000 Sheep.

Situated about 30 miles from Melbourne on a tributary of the Deep Creek, bounded on the north by Lancefield station, on the south by S. and W. Jackson, and W. and J. Headlam, east by Mr. Newsom's and Mr. Clarke, west by Riddle and Hamilton, and J. P. Fawcner north-west.

No. 20.

Barker John.

Name of Run—Cape Schanck.

Estimated Area—9,600 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—600 head of Cattle.

Bounded on the west by the Woolloomerang Creek, on the north and north-east by unoccupied barren land, and on every other part by salt-water.

No. 21.

Barker William.

Name of Run—Mount Alexander.

Estimated Area—30,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—7,000 Sheep.

Commencing from the west side of Hawking's Inn, following Messrs. Heape and Grice's marked trees to a range where they join Mr. Bryant's boundary, following Mr. Bryant's blazed trees as Mr. Cameron's boundary, then south-east about a mile to a burnt hut, then east by south about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles to a high stoney range, then following a range down to a creek running about east and west from that creek a line bearing east by south to Mr. Orr's boundary, thence a line across the ranges to a blazed tree marked No. 7, from that tree in a straight line to the lowest and most eastern dip of Mount Alexander, from thence following the principal range of Mount Alexander to the commencement of Messrs. Heape and Grice's boundary with all the falls of water to this side, from thence by Messrs. Heape and Grice's blazed trees as far as Hawkings' run.

No. 22.

Bear and Godfrey.

Name of Run—East Loddon Station.

Estimated Area—20,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—5,000 Sheep.

Commencing at the junction of the Serpentine Creek with the Loddon River; bounded on or towards the east by the Serpentine Creek and John Bear's run in a line by the course of said creek 14 miles 30 chains, then by a line bearing west 1 mile 14 chains, and bounded on the north by part of A. Thorpe's run, then by a line bearing south 9 miles and 40 chains, and bounded on the west by said A. Thorpe's run, then by a line bearing west and terminating at the Loddon River about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles, then by the course of the Loddon River aforesaid to the junction with the Serpentine creek or commencing point, and bounded on or towards the south-west by Heape and Grice's run which said described land is known as the East Loddon Station.

N.B.—This run has been transferred, with the sanction of the Government, to Mr. John Bear, in whose name the Lease will accordingly be prepared.

No. 23.

Bear and Godfrey.

Name of Run—Boort.

Estimated Area—64,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—16,000 Sheep.

Bounded on or towards the north by M. Millan's run by a line bearing easterly and westerly crossing the centre of Lako Leager and terminating at the east side at the Loddon River, distant from the Lako 2 miles, on the west by Mallie scrub

distant from the Lake 1 mile, on or towards the east by the Loddon River and Booth and Argyle's run, continuing the course of the Loddon River southerly, extending beyond the hut known as Thorpe's hut $\frac{1}{2}$ mile on or towards the south by A. Thorpe's run, being a line bearing west 6 miles, then by a line bearing south-westerly to the Mallie scrub about 6 miles, and on or towards the west by Mallie scrub and Bucka-ah Banyal ranges, bearing north-easterly to the termination of the line running westerly from Lako Leager aforesaid.

N.B.—This run has been transferred, with the sanction of Government, to Henry Godfrey, in whose name the Lease will accordingly be prepared.

No. 24.

Bear John.

Name of Run—Serpentine.

Estimated Area—90,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—20,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the south by Abel Thorpe's run, being a line bearing east from Johnson's public house (commencing on the south side) 7 miles 46 chains to the Bullock Creek, on or towards the east by the Bullock Creek and part of J. Aitken and W. F. Mitchell's runs along the course of the Bullock Creek 15 miles 75 chains, on the north by Booth and Argyle's run being a line bearing west 14 miles 21 chains, and terminating at the Serpentine Creek, and on or towards the west by the Serpentine Creek and Bear and Godfrey's run, by a line along the course of the Serpentine Creek to Johnson's public house or starting point 15 miles 30 chains.

No. 25.

Birch A. and C.

Name of Run—Boolarook.

Estimated Area—10,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—5,000 Sheep.

Boundary with Mr. F. W. Langdon, north $56\frac{1}{4}$ degrees, east 1 mile by a water course, south $33\frac{3}{4}$ degrees, east $2\frac{3}{4}$ miles by marked trees, by thick forest and ranges; south $22\frac{1}{2}$ degrees; west 2 miles, south 3 degrees, east $1\frac{1}{3}$ miles; boundary with Mr. W. H. Bacchus, junr.,—north 45 degrees east $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles by marked trees; south 48 degrees, east $4\frac{3}{4}$ miles by a creek; boundary by 7 hills station, by south $33\frac{1}{2}$ degrees; west $2\frac{2}{3}$ miles and by a creek running south 48 degrees, west $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles.

No. 26.

Birch A. and C.

Name of Run—Seven Hills.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—10,000 Sheep.

Boundary with Mr. John Hepburn, by a creek bearing south 52 degrees, east $6\frac{3}{4}$ miles; boundary with Mr. F. Landen by the same creek 2 miles; boundary by Boolarook station, south $33\frac{1}{2}$ degrees, west $2\frac{2}{3}$ miles, and by a creek running south 48 degrees, west $1\frac{3}{4}$ miles; boundary with Mr. W. J. T. Clarke, north 29 west, by marked trees 2 miles, north 3 degrees, west by a marked tree road $1\frac{1}{4}$ mile, north $71\frac{1}{2}$ degrees, west 1 mile 3 chains marked trees, west 47 chains, and west 47 chains, top scrubby hill north $26\frac{1}{2}$ degrees, east 58 chains; boundary with Mr. D. Coghill, north 5 degrees, west 2 miles by marked trees, north 25, west $1\frac{3}{4}$

miles south, north 42 degrees, west $2\frac{1}{4}$ miles by a creek; boundary with Mr. Campbell, north 42 degrees, east $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles by a ploughed line.

No. 27.

Barnett William.

Name of Run—Major Mitchell's Creek.

Estimated Area—25,600 Acres.

Estimated Gaazing Capabilities—4,500 Sheep.

Scrubby land, north boundary by marked tree by Saunders and M'Boen; south boundary by marked trees by William Hamilton; east boundary by marked trees by Messrs. Nicholson and Roach; west boundary by marked trees by — Saunders.

No. 28.

Bourke Michael and James Neville.

Name of Run—Minton's Creek.

Estimated Area—12,800 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—400 head of Cattle.

Bounded on the north by ranges; on the south by Captain Howey and Mrs. Larimore; on the west by ranges; on the east by the Deep Creek.

No. 29.

Booth and Argyle.

Name of Run—Duck Swamp.

Estimated Area—115,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—2,500 head of Cattle, and 8,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the south by a line running due east 8 miles from a marked tree on the Serpentine Creek, being the boundary with John Bear; then due north about 6 miles, and north-east about $9\frac{1}{2}$ miles, to Pyramid Creek, being boundary line with Jeffery Brothers; then by Pyramid Creek about 2 miles to a marked tree; thence due west about 17 miles to a marked tree on the Loddon River, being a settled boundary with A. M'Callum; then by east bank of Loddon River about 17 miles to a marked tree on Loddon about $1\frac{1}{4}$ mile due east; then due south about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles; then due east $1\frac{1}{4}$ mile to Serpentine Creek, being boundary lines between A. Thorpe, as laid out by Mr. Powlett, C. C. L.

No. 30.

Broadhurst and Tootal.

Name of Run—Belle Vue.

Estimated Area—17,280 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—960 head of Cattle, 6,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north by a ploughed furrow $1\frac{1}{4}$ mile to the Sydney road, being part of the boundary of Pontesford station of Messrs. Tootals, then by a ploughed furrow and marked tree line $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the dry creek, being part of the boundary of Moranding (station of Mr. Sutherland); on the north-east by a part of the boundary of the Dean (station of Mr. Beveridge); on east by a marked tree line running 6 miles to the big hill, being part of the boundary of Mr. Malcolm's station, then by a gully running from the big hill $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile, and by a ploughed furrow 2 miles, being part of the boundary of Mr. Budd; on the south-east by a marked tree line $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles to a creek, being part of Mr. Malcolm's boundary; on the south by Brock's Creek $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile, being part of Mr. Brock's boundary; on the south-west by Steele's Creek, part of Mr. Steele's boundary $2\frac{1}{4}$ miles, and part of Mr. Purves'

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boundary 1 mile; on the west by a marked tree line and ploughed furrow $4\frac{1}{4}$ miles, part of Major Boyd's boundary; and on the north-west by a marked tree line $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles, part of Captain Cain's boundary.

No. 31.

Bennett Henry Grey.

Name of Run—Mount Pleasant.

Estimated Area—32,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north by the continuation of the line from Bertram's Inn east; on the south by the continuation of the line from the Campaspie marked tree east; on the east by the Mount Campbell range; on the west by the Barrie Down run.

No. 32.

Bakewell John and Robert.

Name of Run—Burneweng.

Estimated Area—112,913 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—800 head of Cattle, 12,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north by Alexander Sim's run, commencing at a marked tree on the range, and bearing west to a mound and trench 17 miles 17 chains (crossing the Campaspie River at 4 miles 62 chains); on the west by John Aitken's run, bearing south 10 miles 10 chains to the Picaninny Creek; on the south by Francis Robertson's run, bearing east 8 miles 61 chains 30 links to a marked tree on the Campaspie River, by the Campaspie River downwards to the confluence of the Mount Pleasant Creek, which creek it follows up for 2 miles in a direct line to a marked double tree; thence a line east 6 miles 11 chains 40 links to a stone heap on the range; and on the east by the said range, which separates it from James Cooper and Edward Curr's runs, bearing north in a direct line 10 miles 66 chains to the commencing point.

No. 33.

Bacchus William Henry, junior.

Name of Run—Speeds.

Estimated Area—3,258 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,629 Sheep.

Commencing at a marked tree on the Caimaida Creek, where the present Portland road crosses it, and bounded by that creek towards its source 175 chains from point to point to its junction with a small gully, then along the gully a line bearing 22 degrees south of west extending 38 chains to a plough furrow bearing $3\frac{1}{2}$ south of west extending 82 chains to the head of a gully; thence a line of marked trees bearing 6 degrees north of west extending 101 chains to a dry creek; thence along the dry creek to its junction with the Lorderdorg River, bearing about 20 south of west 22 chains; bounded thence by the Lorderdorg River for 161 chains from point to point; thence a line bearing east 92 chains, south 60 chains, east 40 chains, north 40 chains, east 40 chains to the Caimaida Creek where the present Portland road crosses it.

No. 34.

Name of Station—Barue Down.

Estimated Area—51,200 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—16,000 Sheep.

On the north by a line from Bertram's Inn running north, and a line running west from a known

crossing place on the Campaspie; on the south by a line east from a marked tree within about 3 miles of Caldwell and Ross' head station, and a line west from the junction of the Axe Creek with the Campaspie; on the east by Mount Pleasant run; and on the west by Heape and Grice's stations.

No. 35.

Brodie G. S. and R.

Name of Run—Campaspie.

Estimated Area—20,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—8,000 Sheep.

From a marked tree a little beyond the highest point of the range, running from the head station in a southerly direction up a creek or gully (striking said creek at the angle opposite Mr. Raleigh's out-station hut) to the commencement of a ploughed furrow, distance about 2 miles; bounded by Messrs. Bounded on the north by scrub; on the south by O'Conner and Wedge's runs; on the west by H. and A. Ruffly's station; and on the east by Frederick Ruffly.

Watson, Wight, and Philpott.

Name of Run—Mount Ararat.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—600 head of Cattle.

Northern boundary of Mount Ararat a marked tree, a line running from thence north-east to Mount Ararat Creek, and line running from said tree due west until it intersects a line running north and south from a marked tree forming the boundary; on the west between Mount Ararat station and Jamieson's and Howey's; southern boundary the Great Swamp; eastern boundary Mount Ararat Creek.

Beginning at the running Creek, the boundary line of marked trees for about 3 miles bears east by north towards the main dividing range, and bounded by John Edgell, the aforesaid range is then the boundary with A. Bounded by a curved line starting from a point of the Goulburn situated about north from the north-east point of a plain known as Manton's big plain, which point of the Goulburn is situated about 3 16-38th west of head station, and marked by a ridge of sand hills and small dry creek passing round the eastern side of Manton's big plain, being a distance of about $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles and terminating at south-east point of aforesaid plain, thence by a line about 63 degrees west of south and about 2 45-80th to a boundary point on a plain known as Goolgila plain, thence south a line about 1 11-80th, cutting a marked boundary tree on said plain, and terminating at the southern side of the plain, thence a line about 28 degrees west of south about 7 12-80th, thence east a line about 8 34-80th, thence a line about 28 degrees east of north about 9 24-80th, thence north-east about 1 66-80th, thence by a slightly curved line of about 2 16-80th (passing between the eastern side of the plain known as Walker's upper plain and a small round plain, situated east from it) and terminating at a small dry creek about 35 chains east of the point at which the road first approaches the Goulburn after leaving Mr. Cow-

Bounded on the north by an east and west line from the tree on the Mount Hope Creek marked by Mr. Powlett, extending on the west side of the creek to the Fyramid Creek, adjoining Mr. McCallum's run, and on the other side of the creek to a distance of $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles easterly, adjoining Messrs. J. and W. Collyer's run; bounded on the south by an east and west line over the Mount Hope Creek and sandhill, extending on one side of the creek to the Pyramid Creek, and

on the other side to a distance of $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles, easterly adjoining W. F. Mitchell's run; bounded on the west by the Pyramid Creek; on the east by a plough line, uniting the extremities of the two side lines adjoining Mr. J. H. Patterson's run.
