PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the third year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intitled, "An Act to consolidate and amend the laws for the transportation of offenders in New South Wales, and for defining the respective powers and authorities of General Quarter Sessions, and of Petty Sessions, and for determining the places at which the same shall be holden, and for better regulating the summary jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace, and for repealing certain Laws and Ordinances relating thereto," it was amongst other things enacted, that the Courts of General Quarter Sessions for the said Colony should be holden at such times respectively as the Governor for the time being should by any Proclamation duly issued for such purpose appoint: Now I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint that the said Courts of General Quarter Sessions shall be holden, during the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, at the several times and places hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

At MAITLAND.—On Monday, the 8th of January, the 9th of April, the 9th of July, and the 15th of October.

At SYDNEY.—On Monday, the 5th of February, the 7th of May, the 6th of August, and the 12th of November; and also by adjournments of such Sessions respectively, on Tuesday, the 13th of March, the 12th of June, the 11th of September, and the 11th of December.

At PARRAMATTA.—On Tuesday, the 13th of February, the 15th of May, the 14th of August, and the 20th of November.

At GOULBURN.—On Wednesday, the 21st of March, the 20th of June, the 3rd of October, and the 19th of December.

At BATHURST.—On Thursday, the 26th of April, the 26th of July, and the 1st of November.

**PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH GRANT.**

**FERRY ACROSS THE EDWARD RIVER,  
AT DENILQUIN.**

**A** FERRY having been established across the Edward River, at the Town of Denilquin, in the District of Murrumbidgee, the dues thereof arising for the year commencing 1st January, 1849, shall be put up to auction by the Clerk of Petty Sessions, at the Police Office, at Moulamein, on Tuesday, the 5th December next, at Twelve o'clock, for the terms specified as follows.

The Lessee will be required to provide a sufficient Ferry Boat or Punt to convey, at all times, passengers, horses, carriages, &c., across the river, and to keep the same in suitable repair at his own expense.

A Bond (in double the amount of the rent) with two responsible sureties, will be required for the due observance of the conditions of the lease, and

the regular payment of the rent, by equal monthly instalments, before the expiration of seven days after the termination of each month, together with a Warrant of Attorney.

**CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE  
SETTLED DISTRICTS.**

**CAVEATS.**

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR deems it necessary to desire that all persons lodging Caveats at this Office against the issue of Leases of Crown Land beyond the Settled Districts will observe the following particulars, viz. :—

1st.—Each Caveat should state specifically the nature and extent (with reference to recognised boundaries or natural features) of the alleged encroachment, as required by the Regulation of 7th October, 1847.

2nd.—Whenever any person has occasion to dispute the claims of more than one of his neighbours, or more than one of the claims of the same party, he should, in each case, lodge a separate caveat.

#### FORFEITED AND VACATED RUNS.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that application having been made for the purchase of the Leases of the Runs of Crown Land hereunder described, which after having been occupied, have become vacant (by forfeiture or otherwise) Tenders, in the prescribed printed form, will be received at this Office, until noon of Monday, the 6th day of November next, from the previous applicants, and from any other persons desirous to enter into competition with them, for the purchase of the Lease of any one of the said Runs.

2. Every such Tender must state the term of years, (not exceeding fourteen,) for which it is proposed to take the Run; and whether in addition to the minimum rent required by Her Majesty's Order in Council, it is intended to offer any, and if any, what amount of *yearly* premium for the lease.

#### DISTRICT OF MANEROO.

*The Run known as Cubmurra, formerly occupied by James Hughes, estimated to contain about 16,000 acres.*

Situated on the west side of the north branch of the Snowy River, bounded on the south by James Creek for about 3 miles bearing generally south-west by south; on the west by a line bearing north-easterly to and including a plain on the bank of the said branch, about three miles from its source; and on the north and east by the aforesaid branch of the Snowy River to the junction of James' Creek.

#### DISTRICT OF LIVERPOOL PLAINS.

*The Run known as Pialloway, formerly occupied by Messrs. McDougall, estimated to contain about 16,000 acres.*

DISTRICT OF MURRUMBIDGEE.

No. 1.—*A block of land situated on the River Tumut, and estimated to contain about 10,000 acres.*

Bounded on the north by a creek (Stony) running into the Tumut, and dividing it from the Run of the Messrs. AT 12 o'clock on Tuesday, the 5th day of December next, the Colonial Treasurer will put up to Auction, at the Colonial Treasury, Bent-street, Sydney, the Leases for one year, commencing the 1st day of January, 1849, of the Tolls and Dues authorised and imposed by the Act of the Governor and Council, 2 William IV., No. 12, arising and to be collected at the undermentioned Toll Gates and Ferries, viz. :—

AT THE TOLL GATE.

- 1st.—Near Annandale Bridge, on the road from Sydney to Parramatta. Upset price £2,000.
- 2nd.—At Beckett's Bridge, on the road between Sydney and Parramatta, and also on the road between Parramatta and Liverpool. Upset price £400.
- 3rd.—At Lansdowne Bridge, on the road between Sydney and Liverpool. Upset price £535.
- 4th.—At Broken Back Bridge, on the road between Parramatta and Windsor. Upset price £345.
- 5th.—At Howo's Bridge, near Windsor. Upset price £220.
- 6th.—Near Pitt Row, Parramatta, on the Western Road to Emu Ferry. Upset price £435.

## AND AT THE FERRIES.

7th.—Over the Parramatta River, at Bedlam Point. Upset price £25.

8th.—Over the River Nepean, at Emu Plains. Upset price £400.

9th.—Wiseman's Ferry, over the Macdonald River. Upset price £20.

It being deemed expedient and necessary to raise a larger sum for the repair of the Parramatta Road than has been hitherto collected for this purpose, and the distance between the toll gates at Annandale Bridge, and Beckett's Bridge, respectively, being upwards of 12 miles, it has been determined that from and after the 1st of January, 1849, when these leases will come into effect, toll shall be demanded and payable at both of the abovementioned gates, and that payment at one of them will not, as at present, exempt from payment at the other.

## TO BE PUT UP IN SEPARATE LOTS.

Each Lessee, with two responsible sureties, must enter into a Bond and Warrant of Attorney, securing regular payment of the Rent by equal monthly instalments, before the expiration of seven days after the termination of each month, and containing an engagement binding him to a due observance of the conditions.

The attention of intending bidders is particularly directed to the following articles of the conditions of sale, the requirements of which will be, in future, strictly enforced, viz. :—

“ That the lessees shall be bound, within one month from the commencement of their respective Leases, to put into good plight, state, and condition, as to the repairs thereof, the Turnpike Gate or Ferry respectively leased to them, and all Houses, Erections and Buildings, and as respects the said Ferries, including also all Punts, Boats, Chains, Ropes, and Appurtenances thereunto belonging, and to keep the same in the like state of repair during the whole term or period which the said Leases shall respectively endure; and at the end or sooner determination of the said term, shall surrender and yield up the Gates, Ferries, Buildings, Vessels, and Appurtenances, in a good plight, state, and condition as to the repairs thereof; and if any one or more of the said Lessees shall fail so to do, the Lessee or Lessees so failing shall pay along with his or their last month's Rents, such a sum or sums as shall be requisite to effect the repairs required, to be determined by the report of the Colonial Architect, or any other qualified person appointed to inspect the same under the authority of the Governor, which sum shall become and be a part of the rent agreed to be paid for the said Toll or Ferry respectively; and shall be recoverable in like manner, by distress and sale of the defaulter's goods and chattels, under a warrant to be issued by the said Colonial Treasurer, or the Colonial Treasurer of the Colony for the time being.”

#### RULES AND ORDERS OF THE SUPREME COURT.

In the Supreme Court of New South Wales.

Wednesday, the 25th day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight.

(Despatch of Business.)

1. The several Rules and Orders following are hereby established, for the despatch of business in the several Jurisdictions of the Supreme Court, for the year 1849.

(Civil Terms.)

2. There shall be four Terms in the said year:— which shall commence on the second day of April, the second day of July, the first day of October, and the third day of December respectively; and shall end respectively on the following days, that is to say—the twenty-first day of April, the twenty-first day of July, the twentieth day of October, and the twenty-second day of December respectively.

(Sittings for Causes.)

3. There shall be four Sittings in the year for Causes; to commence on the twelfth day of March, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the eighth day of November, respectively:— at which Sittings, the twenty-sixth day of March, the twenty-first day of May, the sixteenth day of August, and the twenty-sixth day of November, shall be the days for commencing Special Jury Causes, of twelve persons; and the thirtieth day of March, the twenty-eighth day of May, the twentieth day of August, and the thirtieth day of November, shall be the days for commencing Common Juries of twelve persons.

(Juries of Four.)

4. No Cause for trial by a Jury of four persons shall be set down for trial, on or after any of the days appointed as aforesaid, for the trial of Special Jury Causes; but if, on the last day of the Sittings for Causes, triable by a Jury of Four, any of such Causes remain undisposed of, the same shall be proceeded with on such day or days as the Judge presiding on the said last day shall direct.

(Setting down causes.)

5. All Causes, to the extent limited for each day as next mentioned, shall be set down consecutively only; unless in any particular case for some Monday or Thursday of the Sittings, by special order of a Judge. No more than six Causes shall be set down for any day, for trial by a Jury of four persons, nor more than four Causes for trial by a Jury of twelve persons.

(Additional Causes and short Causes.)

6. Provided that (if the Prothonotary shall see fit) ten Causes, for trial by a Jury of four persons, may be set down for each of the first three days, and eight Causes for each of the three following days of the Sittings; and four additional Causes being short or undefended (Specially entered in the list as such,) for each of those days, and for any other day.

(Causes in term, and assessment Causes.)

7. No Cause shall be entered for trial or assessment on any day in Term, other than the first Wednesday only; nor shall any Cause be so entered, of any other nature than such as may be entered for trial in Term now; and no day shall be named in any Writ of Summons, or any notice endorsed thereon, for the assessment of damages, other than such first Wednesday in Term, or some Monday or Thursday

of the Sittings for Causes, for trial by a Jury of four persons, after Term. On every such *Monday* and *Thursday*, Causes entered for Assessment only, or as Short and Undefended Causes, may be taken (notwithstanding the trial simultaneously of other Causes) before a second Judge.

(*Causes on Circuit.*)

8. The day for trying Causes in the Circuit Courts, in February, shall be the following, that is to say:—At Goulburn and Maitland, the fifth day, and at Bathurst the fourth day of the Sittings; and (in September,) at Goulburn and Maitland, the seventh day, and at Bathurst the fifth day of the Sittings.

(*Sydney Gaol Delivery.*)

9. There shall be five Sessions of Gaol Delivery holden at Sydney in the year:—to commence on the fifth day of March, the first day of June, the twenty-third day of August, the first day of November, and the twenty-sixth day of December, respectively; at any of which Sessions there shall be two distinct and separate Sittings, simultaneously, if the Judges shall think fit.

(*Business in Term.*)

10. On every Wednesday in Term, the Primary Judge in Equity will sit at ten o'clock, for common motions and matters only; and at eleven o'clock the full Court will sit, first in its Insolvency Jurisdiction, and then for the disposal of such business as the Judges shall have appointed, or shall then appoint for that day. On Mondays and Thursdays, motions shall have precedence over other business. On Fridays, Demurrers, Special Cases, and Appeals (at law) from Port Phillip, will have precedence.

(*Saturdays in Term.*)

11. On Saturdays, (except where Saturday falls on the last day of Term,) there will be no Sitting. Provided that the Court will sit on every Saturday in Term, at eleven o'clock, for the hearing of further arguments, in any matter then uncompleted, and standing for further argument.

(*New Trial Motions.*)

12. On every day in Term, after the first day, the first six New Trial Motions are to be inserted in the paper, and no more. Any of these may be called on, as the Court shall order; and those in which no brief has been delivered for the moving party may be struck out, with leave to the adverse party to sign judgment.

(*Equity Causes.*)

13. The Primary Equity Judge will sit in Equity on every Tuesday and Thursday, during the Criminal Sittings, and also on every Tuesday during the Civil Sittings for Causes; and at such other times, as he shall from time to time appoint.
