PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the GOVERNOR of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the second year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for repealing so much of an Act, intituled, 'An Act to continue until further provisions shall be made, certain Duties, Tolls, Rates, Fees, or other sums of money imposed by the Governor of New South Wales, and for other purposes, as relates to the levying of Tolls in New South Wales, and for raising a fund towards making, repairing, and upholding Public Roads, Bridges, and Ferries, and for regulating the collection of tolls thereon,'" it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony for the time being, by any Proclamation or Proclamations under his hand, from time to time to appoint places at which Tolls shall be collected, and to cause the same to be collected upon any line of road which has been, or shall be wholly or partly made, and which is repaired at the public expense; and to cause Toll to be collected at any Bridge built, purchased, or repaired at the public expense, and at any Ferry, constructed or upheld at the same, and to cause such Gates, Bars, Chains, Rails, and Fences, to be built and set up, as shall be deemed necessary for preventing passengers, beasts, and carriages from passing, unless there shall be then paid such Toll as shall be due or

demandable under the authority of the said recited Act; and whereas certain Toll Gates are established in the County of Cumberland, and it has become necessary and expedient to raise a larger sum than has hitherto been collected, for the repair of the main roads in the said county, by the establishment of other Toll Gates in addition to those already appointed, for the purposes of the said recited Act: Now, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited Law or Ordinance, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby appoint that from and after the first day of January next ensuing, Turnpike Gates shall be established at the following places, and that Tolls shall be collected thereat to the amount and under the regulations, restrictions, and provisions of the said recited Act or Ordinance; that is to say:—At Carne's Hill, at the junction of the Cowpasture and Bringelly Roads; and on the Campbelltown Road near to Denham Court, about fifty yards on the Liverpool side of the turning to Mr. Cordeaux's at Leppington.

Of which Turnpike Gates all persons concerned are hereby required to take due notice.

OCCUPATION OF CROWN LANDS WITHIN THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

WITH reference to the Regulations published on the 29th March last, His Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed it to be notified, that any person now in actual *licensed* occupation of Crown Lands within the Settled Districts, who before the 31st December next, may make application to purchase any portion not less than 30 acres thereof, will be permitted to occupy on the same terms and at the same rent as at present, the section of which the land applied for forms part, until such portion of land shall have been measured and offered for sale, and an opportunity shall have thus been afforded to him of acquiring the fee simple.

Sections of land of which any portion may be required for sale under the terms of this notice, will not be let under the pre-emptive right conferred by clause 16 of the Regulations of the 29th March last; nor will they be again obtainable on lease, even though no part of them be actually sold. In all such cases those portions of sections which may have been put up for sale and not bid for, or on which the deposit shall have been forfeited, will be kept open to selection for purchase without competition under the provisions of the Land Sales Act, 5 and 6 Vic., cap. 36, and the regulations, thereon founded, of the 1st March, 1843. The remaining portions of the sections will be reserved, until required for sale, for the use of the adjoining holders of Land in fee simple, as a Common.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of public monies, will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each, may be credited in the Accounts of the year within which it was received.

The Heads of Departments and other Officers who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December, to pay into the Colonial Treasury, the unexpended balance of such advances, that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to 31st proximo.

They will also, as soon as practicable, after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not

admit of being previously settled, so that if possible all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.

It being deemed expedient and necessary to raise a larger sum for the repair of the Parramatta Road than has been hitherto collected for this purpose, and the distance between the toll gates at Annandale Bridge, and Beckett's Bridge, respectively, being upwards of 12 miles, it has been determined that from and after the 1st of January, 1849, when these leases will come into effect, toll shall be demanded and payable at both of the abovementioned gates, and that payment at one of them will not, as at present, exempt from payment at the other.
