#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

THEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, " An Act to con-" solidate and amend the laws relating to Courts " of Requests, and to extend the jurisdiction of such " Courts, in the County of Cumberland," it was amongst other things enacted, That from and after the first day of January, 1843, Courts of Requests should be holden in and for such Counties and Districts, or other portions of this Colony and its Dependencies, and at such places respectively, as the Governor should by Proclamation for that purpose from time to time appoint: And whereas by another Act passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her said Majesty, intituled, "In Act to " amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests in " the City of Sydney, and County of Cumberland, "and in the Yown of Melbourne, and County of Bourke respectively," it was enacted, that all Courts of Requests established, or to be established within the City of Sydney and County of Cumberland, and in the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, should respectively have power and authority to hear and determine, in a summary way, all actions whatsoever, for the recovery of any debt, demand, or damage, whether liquidated or unliquidated, te an amount not exceeding thirty pounds : Now I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said first recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint that Courts of Requests, in and for the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, shall be holden, during the year

1849, at the Town of Melbourne, at the times hercinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

The "Ordinary Sittings" of the Court of Requests, for the trial of all cases not exceeding ten pounds, for the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, shall he holden at the Court House, Collinsstreet, Melbourne, on the following days, and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day as may be found necessary, namely:—Monday, 1st January; Monday, 5th February; Monday, 5th March; Monday, 2nd April; Monday, 7th May; Monday, 4th June; Monday, 2nd July; Monday, 6th August; Monday, 3rd September; Monday, 1st October; Monday, 5th November; Monday, 3rd December; Monday, 17th December.
