PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the second year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled, "*An Act for repealing so much of an Act, intituled, 'An Act to continue until further provision shall be made, certain Duties, Tolls, Rates, Fees, or other sums of money imposed by the Governor of New South Wales, and for other purposes, as relates to the levying of Tolls in New South Wales, and for raising a fund towards making, repairing, and upholding Public Roads, Bridges, and Ferries, and for regulating the collection of tolls thereon,'*" it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony for the time being, by any Proclamation or Proclamations under his hand, from time to time to appoint places at which Tolls shall be collected, and to cause the same to be collected upon any line of road which has been, or shall be wholly or partly made, and which is repaired at the public expense; and to cause Toll to be collected at any Bridge built, purchased, or repaired at the public expense, and at any Ferry, constructed or

upheld at the same, and to cause such Gates, Bars, Chains, Rails, and Fences, to be built and set up, as shall be deemed necessary for preventing passengers, beasts, and carriages from passing, unless there shall be then paid such Toll as shall be due or demandable under the authority of the said recited Act; and whereas it has become necessary to appoint a place at the junction, Town of Wellington, on the road passing through that Town, and across the Macquarie River, to the north-western interior, for the purposes of the said recited Act: Now, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited Law or Ordinance, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby appoint the said crossing over the Macquarie River, to be a place at which a Ferry shall be established, and at which Tolls shall be collected, to the amount, and under the regulations, restrictions, and provisions of the said recited Act or Ordinance, of which Ferry all persons concerned are hereby required to take due notice.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fifth and sixth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land,*" it was, amongst other things enacted, that there should be within the said Colony of New South Wales a Legislative Council, to be constituted in the manner and for the purposes in the said Act mentioned, and that the said Council should consist of thirty-six Members, and that twelve of the Members of the said Council should, from time to time in the manner therein mentioned, be appointed by Her Majesty, and that twenty-four of the Members of the said Council should, from time to time, in the manner therein mentioned, be elected by the inhabitants of the said Colony: And whereas by the said recited Act of Parliament, it was further enacted and provided that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, by any Warrant or Warrants, to be from time to time issued by Her Majesty, under Her Sign Manual, and countersigned by one of Her Principal Secretaries of State, to nominate such part of the said Council as according to the said Act, is to be appointed by Her Majesty, and to designate such non-elective Members of the said Council, either by their proper names, or as holders, for the time being, of any public Offices in the said Colony; and that it should also be lawful for Her Majesty, by any such Warrant or Warrants, from time to time, to delegate to the Governor of the said Colony, the power of nominating and designating such non-elective Members of the said Council, either by their proper names, or as holders, for the time being, of any such public Offices as aforesaid, such delegated power being exercised by any such Governor provisionally only, and until Her Majesty's pleasure should be known, but not until the return of the Writs for the election of all the elective Members; and provided always, that not more than half the number of such non-elective Members, should hold any office of emolument under the Crown within the said Colony: And whereas, in pursuance of the said recited Act, Her Majesty has by a Warrant under Her Sign Manual, and countersigned by one of Her Principal Secretaries of State, delegated to me, as such Governor as aforesaid, the power of nominating and designating the non-elective Members of the said Legislative Council, subject to the provisions of the said Act, as hereinbefore recited: Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, as such Governor as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim, that I have accordingly in pursuance of the authority so vested in me, appointed the following gentlemen to be the non-elective Members of the said Legislative Council, until Her Majesty's further pleasure shall be known, viz. ---

## CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

## RUNS OF INSOLVENTS.

REFERRING to that portion of the Regulation of 1st January, 1848, headed "Transfer of Runs," in which it is stated that if a person who had a right to demand a Lease of a Run of Crown Lands in his occupation, under the terms of the 11th section of chapter II of Her Majesty's Order in Council of 9th March, 1847, shall have died or become insolvent without having exercised such right, the demand for the Lease will be received by the Government from his representative, or from any one coming forward on his representative's behalf, His Excellency the Governor deems it proper to caution the Assignees of Insolvent Estates that, in order to secure the rights of their constituents, they must in each case report without delay the sequestration of the Licensee's Estate, and prefer the necessary claims to the Leases of the Runs in his licensed occupation.

2. Should the claim be admitted to be valid the Assignee can, at any time, (subject to the approval of the Government,) transfer his interest in the lease to the person who may become the purchaser of the Run from the Insolvent Estate, by observing the formalities prescribed in the first paragraph of the notice of 1st January last, above referred to.
