PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the GOVERNOR of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the second year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled, "*An Act for repealing so much of an Act, intituled, 'An Act to continue until further provision shall be made, certain Duties, Tolls, Rates, Fees, or other sums of money imposed by the Governor of New South Wales, and for other purposes, as relates to the levying of Tolls in New South Wales, and for raising a fund towards making, repairing, and upholding Public Roads, Bridges, and Ferries, and for regulating the collection of tolls thereon,*" it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony for the time being, by any Proclamation or Proclamations under his hand, from time to time to appoint places at which Tolls shall be collected, and to cause the same to be collected upon any line of road which has been, or shall be wholly or partly made, and which is repaired at the public expense; and to cause Toll to be collected at any Bridge built, purchased, or repaired at the public expense, and at any Ferry, constructed or

upheld at the same, and to cause such Gates, Bars, Chains, Rails, and Fences, to be built and set up, as shall be deemed necessary for preventing passengers, beasts, and carriages from passing, unless there shall be then paid such Toll as shall be due or demandable under the authority of the said recited Act; and whereas it has become necessary to appoint a place at the junction, Town of Wellington, on the road passing through that Town, and across the Macquarie River, to the north-western interior, for the purposes of the said recited Act: Now, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited Law or Ordinance, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby appoint the said crossing over the Macquarie River, to be a place at which a Ferry shall be established, and at which Tolls shall be collected, to the amount, and under the regulations, restrictions, and provisions of the said recited Act or Ordinance, of which Ferry all persons concerned are hereby required to take due notice.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this eleventh day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, and in the twelfth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

ADMISSION OF INSANE PERSONS INTO
LUNATIC ASYLUM.

REFERRING to the notice from this Office, dated 1st January, 1844, respecting the course to be pursued by parties desirous of procuring the admission into the Lunatic Asylum of persons who are insane; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that, under the 11th section of the Act of Council, 7 Victoria, No. 14, all applications of the above description must be accompanied by the following documents, viz. :—

(1.—) A certificate in the form hereto annexed (A), signed by two legally qualified Medical Practitioners, stating that they have examined the person and found him or her to be of unsound mind, and that they consider that such person will be benefited by treatment in the Lunatic Asylum.

(2.—) An application from one or more of the relatives or guardians of the insane person, in the form annexed (B), which must be sanctioned by one of the Judges of the Supreme Court. For this purpose the application must be taken to the Prothonotary or Registrar of the Court or one of the Judges' Clerks.

2nd. In all applications of this nature the relationship in which the applicants stand to the insane persons must be distinctly stated; but in cases where the insane person has no relatives or guardians, the application may proceed from a Justice of the Peace, or from the Directors or Principal Officer of any public Charity.

3rd. The applications when sanctioned by one of the Judges, are to be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary.

4th. The charge for the maintenance in the Lunatic Asylum, of an insane person, male or female is one shilling and four-pence per diem; and, unless in the case of a pauper, the persons seeking the admission of the insane person will be required to furnish to the visiting Justice of the Lunatic Asylum, an engagement from two responsible persons for the regular payment of this sum.

5th. If the application be for the admission of the insane person as a pauper, a certificate will be required, from some respectable person, known to the Government, to the effect not only that such insane person is without funds for his or her maintenance, but that he or she is also without friends who can reasonably be expected to maintain him or her.

Your Petitioner therefore prays that your Excellency will be pleased to direct that the said (A. B.) may be received into such Lunatic Asylum, as your Excellency may think fit to appoint.

NOTE.—If the insane person is sought to be admitted at the public cost the following certificate should be added.

I, (G. H.), of (state residence &c.,) do hereby certify, that to the best of my knowledge and belief (A. B.) who is described in the foregoing petition, has not the means of paying for (his or her) maintenance in the Lunatic Asylum, and that (he or she) has not any relatives or friends who can be reasonably expected to maintain (him or her.)

CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED
DISTRICTS.

RUNS OF INSOLVENTS.

REFERRING to that portion of the Regulation of 1st January, 1848, headed "Transfer of Runs," in which it is stated that if a person who had a right to demand a Lease of a Run of Crown Lands in his occupation, under the terms of the 11th section of chapter II of Her Majesty's Order in Council of 9th March, 1847, shall have died or become insolvent without having exercised such right, the demand for the Lease will be received by the Government from his representative, or from any one coming forward on his representative's behalf, His Excellency the Governor deems it proper to caution the Assignees of Insolvent Estates that in order to secure the rights of their constituents, they must in each case report without delay the sequestration of the Licensee's Estate, and prefer the necessary claims to the Leases of the Runs in his licensed occupation.

2. Should the claim be admitted to be valid the Assignee can, at any time, (subject to the approval of the Government,) transfer his interest in the lease to the person who may become the purchaser of the Run from the Insolvent Estate, by observing the formalities prescribed in the first paragraph of the notice of 1st January last, above referred to.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of public monies, will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each, may be credited in the Accounts of the year within which it was received.

The Heads of Departments and other Officers, who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December, to pay into the Colonial Treasury, the unexpended balance of such advances that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to 31st proximo.

They will also, as soon as practicable, after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.
