PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "*An Act to declare the Town of Sydney, to be a City and to incorporate the Inhabitants thereof,*" it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Council of the said City thereby established, to make, publish, alter, modify, amend or repeal such Bye Laws and Regulations as to them shall seem meet for the several purposes in the said Act specified, provided that no such Bye Laws shall be of any force until the expiration of forty days after the same, or a copy thereof, sealed with the Seal of the Corporation of the said City, shall have been sent to the Governor for the time being of the said Colony: Provided further, that in the case of any such Bye Laws it shall be lawful for the said Governor at any time within such forty days to enlarge as he shall think fit the period within which any such Bye Laws shall remain inoperative; and no such Bye Law shall come into force until after the expiration of such enlarged period: And whereas the said Council did on the tenth day of January last, pass a certain Bye Law, intituled, "*A Bye Law for licensing and regulating Hackney Carriages, and the owners and drivers thereof plying for hire within the City of Sydney, and within the distance of eight miles from the Corporate limits of the said City,*" a copy of which Bye Law, sealed with the Seal of the said Corporation,

was duly sent to the Governor on the fifteenth day of the said month of January: Now therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the first recited Act, do by this my Proclamation order and direct that the period during which the said Bye Law shall remain inoperative, shall be enlarged until the thirty-first day of March next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Wollongong, this twentieth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight; and in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's Reign.

TENDERS FOR RUNS.

REFERRING to the notice dated 1st January last, relative to Tenders for Runs of Crown Lands, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that in the receipt of future Tenders the following rules must be strictly attended to, viz. :—

1. The Tenders will be opened at noon of the day appointed for their receipt,—namely, the first Monday in each month. Any Tender received after that hour will remain over until the time appointed for opening Tenders in the succeeding month, and will be subject to any competition which may arise, by reason of any Tenders received up to that time.
2. No Tender will be entertained in future unless made in the *prescribed printed form*, containing all the necessary particulars.
3. The Tenders must be endorsed “Tender for New Run,” or “Tender for vacated Run,” as the case may require.
4. As it is intended to act strictly on these rules, any person failing to comply with them, will, after this intimation, have no reason to complain, if he shall thereby lose any benefit which a compliance with them would have secured to him.

FORFEITED RUN.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that application having been made for the purchase of the Lease of the Run of Crown Lands hereunder described, which, after having been occupied, has become vacant by forfeiture, sealed Tenders in the prescribed printed form, to be marked “*Tender for Cocomingla Run,*” will be received at this Office, till noon, of Monday, the first day of May next, from the applicant, and from any other persons desirous to enter into competition with him, for the purchase of the Lease of the said Run, for a term not exceeding fourteen years.

2.—Every such Tender must state the term of years, (not exceeding fourteen) for which it is proposed to take the Run; and whether, in addition to the rent required by Her Majesty's Order in Council, it is intended to offer any, and, if any, what amount of yearly premium for the Lease.

3.—As the grazing capabilities of the Run have not yet been determined, it will be necessary that each Tender contain an estimate of the number of sheep or cattle that the Run will carry.

4.—Until the Run has been regularly surveyed, and its grazing capabilities determined, the future lessee will be required to pay according to his own estimate, as given in his Tender; and in the event of the rent so paid proving to have been less than that determined by valuation, he will be required to make up the difference, previously to the execution of the Lease.

5.—It is also to be distinctly understood, that the Government reserves to itself the right of excluding from the Lease of this Run, any portion of it which it may be deemed proper to reserve for any of the purposes referred to in the 9th section of chapter II, of Her Majesty's Order in Council.

GRANT OF LAND.

THE following description of a Grant of Land, with the name of the person to whom it was originally promised, or by whom it is now claimed, is published for general information, in order that

the parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

It is requested that within *one month* from the present date, the following particulars may be accurately furnished to this Office, viz:—

Surname and all Christian names of the person in whose favor the deed is to be prepared, written at full length, his residence, and the intended name of the property.

If these be duly furnished and satisfactory, and if no caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty appear, the Deeds will be prepared accordingly, as soon as possible after the expiration of the stated period of one month.

If the required particulars be not furnished within that period, or if a caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty arise which cannot be satisfactorily determined by the Government, the case will be referred to the Commissioners of Claims, and the parties subjected to the expense of that proceeding.

TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the morning of Sunday, the 13th instant, a rape was committed on the person of a female residing at a Station of the Australian Agricultural Company, in the County of Gloucester, by an aboriginal native, named "Darley," His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Twenty-five pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may within six months from this date, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension, and lodging in safe custody of the guilty party; and if the person giving such information be a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to such prisoner of the Crown of a Conditional Pardon available everywhere except in the Country in which he was originally convicted.

FERRIES ON THE NEW LINE OF ROAD FROM SYDNEY TO MAITLAND, BY WAY OF BRISBANE WATER.

THE undermentioned Ferries having been established on the new line of Road from Sydney to Maitland, by way of Brisbane Water, the dues arising from the same will be put up to auction, by the Colonial Treasurer, at the Colonial Treasury, Bent-street, Sydney, at twelve o'clock of Tuesday, the 7th day of March, 1848, for twelve months, commencing the 1st day of April, 1848.

Lot 1.—Ferry at the crossing on the Hawkesbury River.

Lot 2.—Ferry at the crossing on Mooney Mooney Creek.

Lot 3.—Ferry at the crossing on Narrara Creek.

The lessee of each Ferry will be required to provide a sufficient ferry boat or punt to convey, at all times, passengers, horses, carriages, &c., across the river or creeks, and keep the same in suitable repair at his own expense.

A bond (in double the amount of the rent,) with two responsible sureties, will be required for the due observance of the conditions of the lease, and the regular payment of the rent by equal monthly instalments, before the expiration of seven days after the termination of each month, together with a warrant of attorney.
