PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the GOVERNOR of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the second year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for repealing so much of an Act, intituled, 'An Act to continue until further provisions shall be made, certain Duties, Tolls, Rates, Fees, or other sums of money imposed by the Governor of New South Wales, and for other purposes, as relates to the levying of Tolls in New South Wales; and for raising a fund towards making, repairing, and upholding Public Roads, Bridges, and Ferries, and for regulating the collection of Tolls thereon,'" it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony for the time being, by any Proclamation or Proclamations under his hand, from time to time to appoint places at which Tolls shall be collected, and to cause the same to be collected upon any line of road which has been, or shall be wholly or partly made, and which is repaired at the public expense; and to cause Toll to be collected at any Bridge built, purchased, or repaired at the public expense, and at any Ferry, constructed or upheld at the same, and to cause such Gates, Bars, Chains, Rails, and Fences, to be built and set up, as shall be deemed necessary for preventing passengers, beasts, and carriages from passing, unless there shall be then paid such Toll as shall be due or demandable under the authority of the said recited Act; and whereas it has become necessary to appoint places on the new line of road from Sydney to Maitland by way of Brisbane Water for the purposes

of the said recited Act: Now, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited Law or Ordinance, do, by this my Proclamation hereby appoint

The crossing on the Hawkesbury River,
The crossing on Mooney Mooney Creek; and
The crossing on Narrara Creek,

on the said new line of road from Sydney to Maitland, to be places at which Ferries shall be established, and at which Tolls shall be collected, to the amount, and under the regulations, restrictions, and provisions of the said recited Law or Ordinance, of which Ferries all persons concerned are hereby required to take due notice.

TWENTY POUNDS REWARD OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the third instant the mail from Mudgee was stopped by an armed bush-ranger, about two miles and a half from the Middle River, when the bags and letters were opened and the contents abstracted; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a reward of twenty pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may within six months from the present date, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the party guilty of the above outrage; or if the person giving such information be a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon, (available everywhere except in the country in which the prisoner was originally convicted,) to such prisoner of the Crown.

The robber is described as about 5 feet 9 or 10 inches in height, of middle age; his face was covered by a bag; he had on fustian or moleskin trowsers, very dirty, and a common striped shirt, with a red handkerchief round his waist.
