**TWENTY POUNDS REWARD OR A  
CONDITIONAL PARDON.**

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the third instant the mail from Mudgee was stopped by an armed bush-ranger, about two miles and a half from the Middle River, when the bags and letters were opened and the contents abstracted; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a reward of twenty pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may within six months from the present date, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the party guilty of the above outrage; or if the person giving such information be a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made

to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon, (available everywhere except in the country in which the prisoner was originally convicted,) to such prisoner of the Crown.

The robber is described as about 5 feet 9 or 10 inches in height, of middle age; his face was covered by a bag; he had on fustian or moleskin trowsers, very dirty, and a common striped shirt, with a red handkerchief round his waist.

H. M. Surveying Ship "Rattlesnake," off Port Jackson, 13th January, 1848.

SIR,

I beg leave to state for the information of Masters of Vessels trading to Moreton Bay, that the Outer Black Buoy marked A, in Captain Wickham's chart, has been driven from its position, (during a heavy gale of wind from the N.E.) a mile and a half to the S.-S.W. (Magnetic) and it is now inside the shoal altogether, in 7 fathoms water. The Buoys B and C remain in their proper places.
