## CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

(TRANSFER OF RUNS.)

**W**ITH reference to the Notice of 1st January, 1848, headed "*Transfer of Runs,*" in which it is provided, that "in consideration of the delay that must necessarily take place in the issue

of Leases of Runs demanded under the 11th section of chapter II of Her Majesty's Order in Council of the 9th March, 1847, any licensed occupant who, after having demanded his Lease, may desire to part with his interest in the same, will be allowed to have the Lease made out in favor of any person recommended by the Commissioner of the District, on making written application, in the manner in the said Notice prescribed, but that, in this case, the original applicant will be debarred from all further claim to the Lease, the right of which will be thenceforth held to be vested in the person in whose favor he requested that it should issue;" His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified, that in all cases in which Claimants of Leases of Runs shall have alienated their right thereto, under the provisions of the Notice above cited, the licenses for such Runs for the ensuing year will be issued not to the persons who previously held them, but to the proposed transferees.

**GROSE FARM.**

**WHARVES.**

**C**ONSIDERABLE injury having been done to the navigation of the Harbour of Port Jackson, and other navigable waters of the Colony, by parties who have been allowed to erect Wharves, having extended them beyond the authorised limit by throwing rubbish into the water, His Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct that in future no permission to form a Wharf, or extend one already made will be given without a stipulation, rendering it imperative that such wharf be fenced with stone, or in such other manner as will effectually prevent the injury complained of, to be accompanied by a bond, with two sureties for the due observance of all the conditions upon which such permission is granted.

All applications for this purpose must be accompanied by a tracing, showing the nature and extent of the proposed Wharf, and must contain the names of two solvent persons willing to become sureties for the due observance of the conditions above referred to.

And in order that the neighbouring landholders whose interests may possibly be affected by such Wharves, may have an opportunity of stating their objections, all applications for permission to erect them will be duly notified in the *Government Gazette* at least one month before being granted.
