Description of the Bushrangers referred to in the above Notice.

John Roach alias Dubbo; stated to be a dark complexioned, black whiskered man, about 5 feet 10 inches in height, was dressed in a blue frock, moleskin trowsers, and cabbage tree hat.

Thomas Gregory; a short stout man, light complexion and whiskers, about 5 feet 5 inches in height, was dressed in a Guernsey frock and corduroy trowsers.
