**W**HEREAS the Legislative Council of New South Wales now stands prorogued to the eighth day of February next: Now I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said Colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the twenty-first day of March next; and I do hereby further announce and proclaim, that the said Council shall assemble for the despatch of business on the aforesaid twenty-first day of March next, at Twelve o'clock at noon, in the Council Chamber, situate in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney, and the Members of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this twentieth day of January, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, and in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's Reign.

ACTS OF COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies has intimated, in his Despatch, under date the 31st July last, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to approve and confirm the undermentioned Acts, passed by the Governor and Legislative Council, in the tenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, viz. :—

10TH VICTORIA.

- No. 1.—“An Act to prevent for a limited time, Party Processions, and other Public Exhibitions in New South Wales.” (27th October, 1846.)
- No. 3.—“An Act to prevent the desertion of Seamen belonging to foreign ships and vessels.” (30th October, 1846.)

TWENTY POUNDS REWARD OR A  
CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the third instant the mail from Mudgee was stopped by an armed bush-ranger, about two miles and a half from the Middle River, when the bags and letters were opened and the contents abstracted; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a reward of twenty pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may within six months from the present date, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the party guilty of the above outrage; or if the person giving such information be a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon, (available everywhere except in the country in which the prisoner was originally convicted,) to such prisoner of the Crown.

The robber is described as about 5 feet 9 or 10 inches in height, of middle age; his face was covered by a bag; he had on fustian or moleskin trowsers, very dirty, and a common striped shirt, with a red handkerchief round his waist.
