HEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the evening of the 26th of October last, three aboriginal women and a male child, were murdered at Canning Creek, in the District of Darling Downs, by a party of seven white persons; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a reward of twenty-five pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may within six months from the present date, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of any one of the individuals concerned in this outrage; and, if such information be afforded by a prisoner of the Crown, that application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to such convict of a Conditional Pardon.

His Excellency further directs it to be notified, that a pardon will be granted to any one of the persons concerned in this outrage, (not being the actual perpetrators thereof,) who will give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of any one or more of his accomplices.
