PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS Her Majesty was pleased, by Letters Patent, bearing date at Westminster, the seventeenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, to erect into a separate Colony, to be known and designated as the Colony of "North Australia," all those parts of the territories theretofore comprised within the Colony of New South Wales, lying to the northward of the twenty-sixth degree of south latitude; and whereas Her Majesty, by Letters Patent bearing date at Westminster, the twenty-eighth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, was further pleased to revoke and determine the said Letters Patent, establishing the said Colony of North Australia; and whereas by a Commission, under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, addressed to me as such Governor as aforesaid, and bearing date at Westminster, the twentieth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, Her Majesty did thereby define the Territory or Colony of New South Wales, as comprising all that portion of the Territory of Australia or New Holland, lying between the one hundred and twenty-ninth and one hundred and

fifty-fourth degrees of east longitude, and between the twenty-sixth and fortieth degrees of south latitude, including all the islands adjacent in the Pacific Ocean, within the latitudes aforesaid, save and except that part of Her Majesty's said Territory which is called and known by the name of the Province of South Australia: Now I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, as such Governor as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and notify that, by Letters Patent dated at Westminster, the third day of April last past, Her Majesty was pleased to declare and ordain, that in addition to all the territory defined and comprised as aforesaid, the Territory or Colony of New South Wales shall comprehend all Her Majesty's said Territory lying northward of the twenty-sixth degree of south latitude, with all the islands adjacent in the Pacific Ocean;—and all persons are required to take notice thereof accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Territory, at Government House, Sydney, this sixteenth day of January, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and in the twelfth year of Her Majesty's reign.
