PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Legislative Council of New South Wales now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the first day of January next, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now, therefore, I, SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested, as Governor of the said Colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the twelfth day of February now next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this eighteenth day of December, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and in the thirteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

GRANTS OF LAND TO THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF SYDNEY.

**T**HE descriptions of the following Grants of Land which have been appropriated to the City Corporation for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, are published for general information, in order that the parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

At the expiration of one month from this date, if no caveat be lodged or other cause of uncertainty appear, a Deed of Grant of the same will be prepared, viz. :—

62. ALEXANDRIA, 172a. 1r. 20p., One hundred and seventy-two acres one rood and twenty perches, County of Cumberland, parish of Alexandria, at the Lachlan Swamp; commencing at the westernmost corner bearing south 39 degrees 5 minutes west, and distant 90 links from the centre of the mouth of the tunnel, and bounded towards the north-west by a line bearing north 39 degrees 5 minutes, east 31 chains; towards the east by a line bearing south 5½ degrees, east 28 chains 13 links; towards the north by a line bearing north 69 degrees, east 41 chains 21 links; towards the east by a line bearing east 69 degrees, south 24 chains 4 links; towards the south by a line bearing south 69 degrees, west 51 chains 94 links, and towards the south-west by a line bearing north 34 degrees 35 minutes, west 36 chains 78 links to the commencing westernmost corner.
