TO CONTRACTORS AND OTHERS.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that Tenders will be received at this Office until noon of Monday, 12th of February next, from persons willing to contract for the undermentioned repairs to a portion of the Bathurst road lying within the District of Hartley.

1. Preparing six cross drains, situated between the top of the Junction Hill and Magpie Hollow, by clearing the drains, re-covering the top with slabs of not less than four inches thickness, or with logs of six inches diameter at least, and overspreading the same with gravel above the level of the road. The water tables also to be cleared at least two yards above each drain.

2. Filling in four chasms close by the above drains, level with the road, and covering the same with gravel, and clearing and deepening the adjoining water tables to the extent of half a mile.

3. To repair the hill leading from the Junction Bridge, a distance of one mile (more or less) by clearing and deepening the water tables and drains and making good the road with gravel where required, by filling in the ruts.

4. To repairs on the road leading from Cox's River towards Solitary, First, by making good fifty yards from the river, by raising the centre with gravel, and building up the sides where they have given way. Second, clearing watercourses and cross drains, and filling up the holes and watercuts with gravel for a distance of two miles, (more or less.) That portion of the road lying between two deep cuttings, the holes to be filled up with stone to a level with the present rocks, and then covered with gravel twelve inches deep at least, in the centre.

5. To repair a portion of the road at Bowen's Fells, commencing where the Mudgee road branches off, and ending at the house on the opposite hill occupied by Powell, by clearing water tables, and cross drains, and making good the road by filling in the ruts with gravel.

The above portion of the road will be pointed out and full particulars obtained on application at this Office. Tenders will be accepted for the whole or any part of the repairs. The work must be approved of by the undersigned before any payment will be made, but on approval, money will be paid as the work progresses in proportion to the quantity done.
