PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the sixth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the division of the Colony of New South Wales into Electoral Districts, and for the election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council*," it is amongst other things enacted, that as divers of the Electoral Districts appointed by the said Act are far distant from the seat of Government, and of great extent, and unforeseen difficulties or delays may arise in carrying into effect the several provisions in the said Act mentioned, in regard to the Elections for the said Districts, it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, within the period of twenty days before or after the day appointed for the holding of any Election, to extend the time allowed for the holding of such Election, or for the return of the Writ issued for the same; and whereas a Writ was issued for the Election of a Member to serve in the Legislative Council for the Electoral District of Port Phillip, which Writ was made returnable on the thirteenth day of March instant, and it is expedient to extend the time for the return of the said Writ: Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus

Fitz Roy, as such Governor aforesaid, do, by this my Proclamation, declare that, with the advice of the Executive Council, I have extended, and I do hereby extend the time allowed for the return of the said Writ to the twentieth day of March instant.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this second day of March, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and in the twelfth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
