ROADS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR having deemed it expedient to open and make certain parish Roads in the Hunter's River Districts as hereunder described: Notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 4th William IV., No. 11, intituled, "An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof," surveys and tracings, shewing the intended lines of the said Roads, are now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General, and all persons interested therein are requested to transmit in writing, addressed to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from this date, any well-grounded objection which may exist to the formation of the said Roads, viz:—

- 1.—Line of Road from Muswellbrook to Merton, commencing at the centre of the Bridge, crossing Muswellbrook.
- 2.—Line of Road from Singleton, by Jerry's Plains to Merton, commencing at the Ford at Singleton.

TWENTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

FROM SYDNEY TO MAITLAND BY WAY
OF BRISBANE WATER.
