PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of New South Wales for the time being, to fix such place or places within any part of the said Colony, and such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council constituted under the said recited Act, as he may think fit: Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, as such Governor aforesaid, do hereby in pursuance of the power and authority so in me vested, announce and proclaim that the first Session of the present Legislative Council for the despatch of business shall commence and be holden on Tuesday, the fifteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, at Twelve of the clock at noon, in the building known as the Council Chambers, situated in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney; and the Members of the said Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my hand and seal, at Melbourne, Port Phillip, this twentieth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and in the twelfth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

SYDNEY STREETS.

WHEREAS by an Act of the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the fifth year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled, "*An Act for better regulating the alignment of Streets in the Town of Sydney*," it is amongst other things enacted, that before the said Surveyor General shall set out the footway in any street, or part of a street, or public place in the said town, after the passing of the said Act, he shall lay before the Governor and Executive Council a plan of the same, setting forth the proposed breadth of the carriage and footways, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Governor and Council, by notice in the *New South Wales Government Gazette*, to fix and declare the distance from the curbstone, or exterior edge of the said footway, in any such street, part of a street, or public place, within which it shall not be lawful to erect any building.

And whereas the said Surveyor General has laid before the Governor and Executive Council, a plan shewing the proposed breadth of the carriage and footways in the undermentioned public place and streets, and the Governor and Council have been pleased to approve the same: Notice is hereby given, that the breadth of each footway in the said public place and streets shall be and is hereby declared to be twelve feet; and that it shall not be lawful for any person to erect any building within twelve feet of the curbstone, or exterior edge of any of the said footways.

OF BRISBANE WATER.
