William Davis, per "Mandarin," 1843, arrived free at Port Phillip; native place, Staffordshire; occupation, seaman; age, 19 years; height, 5 feet 1½ inches; make, slight and inclined to stoop; sharp features; complexion, fresh; hair, light brown; eyes, hazel.

The stoop is more in the neck than on the back, the head protrudes. Convicted at Melbourne, of assault, with intent, &c., on December 18th, 1847, and sentenced 3 years labour on roads.

Thomas Morrison, per "Countess Harcourt," 1827, bond; native place, Belfast; occupation, laborer; age, 35 years, but looks more; height, 5 feet 5½ inches; make, stout, square shoulders; complexion, pale, from confinement; forehead, wrinkled; broad flat face, with heavy eyebrows; eyes, grey; hair, dark brown; no whiskers; speaks with a peculiar hollow voice. Sentence, transportation for life; commuted to 10 years labor on roads.
