RURAL POLICE.—CLOTHING.

Thaving been represented to the Government that the Police of the Country Districts, when on escort or other duty to Sydney, are not usually in the habit of wearing their Police Uniform; His Excellency the Governor directs the attention of the respective Benches of Magistrates in the Country Districts to this matter, in order that the Constabulary may be strictly enjoined to appear in their proper official clothing when visiting Sydney on duty.
