**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by an Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the second year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other Towns respectively, and for the removing and preventing nuisances and obstructions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein,*" it was amongst other things enacted, that whenever the Governor or Acting Governor for the time being, should deem it expedient to extend the said Act to any other Towns in the said Colony, it should and might be lawful for the said Governor or Acting Governor for the time being, to declare the same by Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby direct that the provisions of the said Act, as amended by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the eleventh year of Her said Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to amend an Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other Towns respectively, and for the removing and preventing nuisances and obstructions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein,*" be extended to the Town of Balmain, in the County of Cumberland.

Given under my hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this thirtieth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

In the Supreme Court  
of New South Wales.

Saturday, the 31st day of August, in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty.

The several General Rules and Regulations following, shall commence and take effect on and from the 10th day of September next.

*Offices. Hours of Attendance.*

1. The hours of attendance in the several Offices of the Court, on every day not being Sunday or a Holiday, in Term and Vacation alike, shall be from a quarter before 10 o'clock in the morning, until 4 o'clock in the afternoon.—Provided that the Offices shall only be open to the Public, from 10 to  $\frac{1}{2}$  past three o'clock; and that during the half-yearly Vacations, the hours of Attendance shall be from ten o'clock until one only.

*Duties of Master in Equity.*

(4 Vic., No. 22, s. 22.)

2. The Master in Equity shall, by himself or his Clerks, besides the duties of Curator of Intestate Estates, discharge all the duties which are discharged, in England, by the Masters, Examiners,

Registrars, and Clerks, of and in the High Court of Chancery; and shall, also, whenever specially so directed, by Rule or Order in any Cause or Matter, discharge such other duties, as shall by such Rule or Order be entrusted to him.

*Duties of Prothonotary.*

3. The Prothonotary and Registrar shall, as Prothonotary have charge of the Records in the Common Law and Criminal jurisdictions, and, as Registrar, in the Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, of the Court; and shall, by himself or his Clerks, discharge all other duties, incident to the offices of Master, Taxing Officer, and Sealer of Writs, in the Queen's Bench, and to the Office of Registrar in the prerogative Court of Canterbury. Provided that the duties of Clerk of Arraignment, and Clerk and Associate at Nisi Prius, shall be discharged by the Judges' Clerks respectively; and that they shall also sit for the Prothonotary, in banc, whenever he shall be unable personally to attend there.

*Duties of Judges' Clerks.*

4. The Judges' Clerks, in addition to their ordinary duties as such, shall discharge all the duties appertaining to Clerks in Chambers, or in attendance for Chamber Business; and shall sit, severally, as Clerks of Arraignment, and of Assize and Nisi Prius, in Sydney, as well as on Circuit.—They shall prepare, also, the Criminal Calendars and Returns, and all Estreats and Jury Precepts; and record all Wills.

*Rules repealed.*
