## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies*," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that at Eleven o'clock of Wednesday, the twentieth day of November next, the following Town, Suburban, and Country Lots of Land will be offered for sale, by public auction, at the several places hereunder mentioned, and at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions and under the provisions of the above recited Act. And whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Councillors of the said City of Melbourne have addressed to me, as the Governor aforesaid, a petition, signed by the Mayor for the time being of the said City, and sealed with the seal of the Corporation, praying that I would increase the number of Wards, within the corporate limits of the City of Melbourne, by the erection, in the manner directed by the said recited Act, of the portion of land known as the suburb of "Collingwood," and described in the annexed Schedule, into a distinct and separate Ward; Now, therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, by this my Proclamation, published in the manner directed by the said recited Act, do, in pursuance of the power thereby in me invested, declare the suburb of "Collingwood," as hereunder described, to be a Ward of the said City of Melbourne, according to the intendment of the said recited Act.
