AD VALOREM DUTIES.

THE waterside Officers of this Department, having latterly experienced considerable difficulty in levying the Ad Valorem Duties on goods imported into this Colony, and being of opinion that the difficulty results in a great measure from a misapprehension as to the true meaning of the word "value" required to be used in the declaration made at the time of entering goods liable to such kind of Duty; I do hereby call the attention of the public to the Government Notice of the 24th January, 1843, (vide Government Gazette of that date,) wherein His Excellency the Governor for the time being, the late Sir George Gipps, in consequence of the opinion expressed by the Law Officers of the Crown, directed that the word value in the declaration referred to, should be held to mean the value of the several articles, at the time, when and at the place where the declaration may be made, and not the value at the place from which the articles may have been imported.
