**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, has intimated in his Despatch, under date the 13th August last, No. 112, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to approve and confirm the undermentioned Act, passed by the Governor and Legislative Council in the thirteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, viz.:-

13TH VICTORIA.

No. 35.—An Act further to amend the law relating to Quarantine in New South Wales. (9th October, 1849.)

ACTS OF COUNCIL.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies has intimated in his Despatch, under date the 5th July last, No. 92, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to approve and confirm the undermentioned Acts passed by the Governor and Legislative Council in the thirteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, viz.:-

13TH VICTORIA.

No. 1.—An Act to confer on all Justices of the Peace, for the City of Sydney, certain powers heretofore vested in the Police Magistrates of the said City. (12th July, 1849.)

No. 2.—An Act for the better protection of Works of Art, and Scientific and Literary Collections. (12th July, 1849.)

No. 3.—An Act to amend the law in respect to the safe custody of persons dangerously insane, and the care and maintenance of persons of unsound mind. (12th July, 1849.)

No. 5.—An Act for punishing criminally Drivers of Stage Coaches and Carriages for accidents occasioned by their wilful misconduct. (12th July, 1849.)

No. 6.—An Act to punish false Declarations by Members of the Legislative Council, and to give certain Select Committees thereof power to examine and compel the attendance of Witnesses. (12th July, 1849.)
