PILOTS.

THE following additional Regulations, framed by the Pilot Board of Port Jackson, for the conduct of the Pilot Establishment of this Port, having been approved by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

*By His Excellency's Command,
E. DEAS THOMSON.*

- 1st.—That the night look-out shall be kept, for the future, at the Signal Station.
- 2nd.—That one of the crew of each Pilot Boat shall be in attendance at this Station at sundown, and should any vessel be discovered at any hour during the night, the man belonging to the Pilot, first in turn, shall leave the look-out, and call his master; and so on in rotation until all the Pilots may have been employed.
- 3rd.—That a minute book be kept at the Signal Station, in which an entry shall be made of the time each man leaves the look-out to call his master on sighting a vessel.
- 4th.—On the usual signal being made by a vessel in the offing for a Pilot after dark, a blue light

shall be burnt at the look-out, to shew that the signal has been seen.

- 5th.—Pilots going out to vessels during the night shall be required to carry a lantern with a strong reflector, which shall be shewn on approaching the vessel.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

2. The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of Public Monies will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each may be credited in the accounts of the year within which it was received.

3. The Heads of Departments and other Officers who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December to pay into the Colonial Treasury the unexpended balance of such advances, that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to the 31st proximo.

4. They will also, as soon as practicable after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

5. The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith on the part of the Government Officers concerned.
