#### LUNACY MATTERS.

#### Commissions to whom directed.

1. After the first day of March next, every Commission in Lunacy shall be directed to one Commissioner only, who shall be a Barrister-at-Law, who shall (if the Judges shall in any case so direct) be assisted by a physician or surgeon as assessor.

#### Fees Payable.

2. The following fees shall hereafter be payable in lunacy, that is to say-

To the Commissioner and Assessor, for the first meeting under the Commission, each 3 3 C And for every hour beyond three hours, each 0 10 to For each adjourned meeting, whether more or less than three hours .... Solicitor's fee on the first meeting .... On each adjourned meeting..... 0 13 To each Juryman on the first meeting. 0 10 6 On each adjourned meeting..... To the Sheriff or his Deputy ..... No fee.

#### Practice in Lunacy Matters.

3. The Practice in Lunacy Proceedings, with respect to Petitions, before Grant of the Lunatic's Person and Estate, (and, after such Grant, in all other respects,) shall be the same as may be as in Proceedings in Equity, and the same fees shall be payable.

#### EQUITY PRACTICE.

THE following General Rules are established, to take effect on and from the first day of March next.

Decrees ex parte.—Evidence. Prac. 286.

1. Where the plaintiff shall proceed to obtain a Decree for want of appearance, (or after appearance for want of answer,) under the ninth, tenth, eleventh, and twelfth, of the standing rules, or any of them, he may examine witnesses and give other evidence, ex parte, without any replication, subpœna to rejoin, or appointment for the examination of witnesses. And all evidence then taken may be used in case of a re-hearing.

Same. Appearance for Defendant.

2. The said twelfth rule shall equally apply to cases in which the plaintiff shall enter an appearance for the defendant.

Same. Service on Defendant. Prac. 287.

3. The plaintiff may proceed to a Decree Nisi, under the said twelfth rule, where he shall file an affidavit of due service on the defendant of the notice to be put in his answer; and in all cases where a bill shall be taken pro confesso, under that rule, it shall be read as evidence for the plaintiff.

#### Relief in certain cases by Petition.

4. In all cases where no discovery by answer is sought, but forcelosure or redemption only, or an account, specific performance, the appointment of new trustees, the assignment of dower, or a partition of land, or an injunction against the receipt of rents, and for the appointment of a receiver, the same relief may be given by order upon Petition, and without Bill, as by Docree in a suit by Bill: Provided that all proceedings, consequent upon the order granting such relief, shall be the same as on a like decree in a suit. And, for all purposes, such proceedings shall be considered as

#### Proviso. Judge may direct a Bill.

5. Provided also, that where, upon the hearing of any such Petition, the Primary Judgo shall think the case not one proper to be determined summarily, he may direct a Bill to be filed, and in every such case the costs of such Potition and thereof, shall be retained in the Bank as a voucher the proceedings thereon shall be in his discretion, I and for reference.

Time for answering shortened. Prac. 285.

6. The eighth Equity rule, respecting the time for answering bills, shall be amended, by substituting four weeks for eight weeks in town causes, and six weeks for ten weeks in country causes; provided that where the defendant resides two hundred miles or upwards from Sydney the time shall be ten weeks as at present. And no cause shall, within that rule, be deemed a town cause, unless the party resides with in the County of Cumberland.

Time to unswer after Amendment.

7. Where a Bill is amended before Answer, the defendant shall have the same time under that rule, after service of the amendment, as he was entitled to originally.

Certain references to the Master.

8. All references hereafter to the Master, when guardians, new trustees, receivers, or committees of lunatics, are required to be appointed, shall be for appointment by the Master, in the first instance: - and a cortificate by him (which shall not require confirmation by the Court, but shall be liable to be reviewed,) of such appointment, and of the allowance for the maintenance of the infant, or lunatic, or of the settling of any deed, when settled by him, shall be filed in the Master's Office. Copies of Affidavits. Prac. 306; and 293.

9. No copy need hereafter be served of any Affidavit, for the purpose of any motion or petition, or of any proceedings in the Master's Office. -And every Affidavit filed may be read, when required, without any office copy thereof having been taken.

#### Sale of Land by Auction.

10. When any property is ordered to be sold by the Master, he shall by memorandum in writing, (without any proposal or writing being laid before him,) appoint an auctioneer to sell such property; who shall proceed to the sale in the usual manner, and be paid a per centage, or fixed stated sum, to be fixed by the Master at the time of such appointment. 'And such auctioneer shall pay over to the Master any deposit which he may receive, to the credit of the cause in which the order for sale was made, within three days after he shall have received the same; and shall state what he has done in respect of the sale, upon affidavit, to be filed in the Master's Office.

Bidding by  $oldsymbol{P}$ arties to the Suit.

11. No order shall be necessary for allowing any party to the record to bid at such sale, if he would be allowed, by law, to bid at the same sale, in case it had not been under an Order of Court.

#### Bank of Equity Deposits.

12. The Bank of Australasia shall continue to be the Bank of this Court, for the moneys of suitors in Equity; and the Master shall deposit all moneys in his hands in the said Bank; and no moneys so deposited shall be withdrawn from or paid out of the said Bank, without an Order signed by one of the Judges, and countersigned by the Master; which Order, or a counterpart Serving Copies of Decrees on Master.

13. It shall not be necessary in future to serve the Master with the copy of any Decree or Order, or of any part of a Decree or Order, in respect of any reference under it.

Petitions; how answered.

14. No Potition for hearing by the Primary Judge, and no Potition of Appeal, shall be answered by the Judges, or any of them, but the Master shall indorse thereon and sign the usual answer.

Petitions to be filed.

15. All Petitions (not being Petitions of Appeal) shall be filed two days at the least before the day fixed by such indersement for the hearing.

Fee abolished.

16. No fee shall hereafter be payable in the Master's Office for a subposna to rejoin.

Copies of Exhibits.

17. All parties or persons giving Exhibits in evidence before the Master shall furnish him with a copy of such of them, or such parts of them, as he may require, either on the application of a party to the sait, or without any such application.

Certain Fees to Solicitors regulated. 18. The Solicitor's fee for attending the Master on the examination of witnesses, preparatory to the hearing, shall be henceforth thirteen shillings and four-pence for the first hour, and six shillings and eight-pence for every subsequent hour. And his fee for attendance in Court at the hearing of a cause, or on further direction, shall be two pounds two shillings for the first day, and thirteen shillings and four-pence for every subsequent day. The fee for instructions for bill or for drawing any petition in substitution for a bill, shall be from thirteen shillings and four-pence to three pounds three shillings, according to circumstances; and on attendances in Court on the hearing of any motion or petition, exceeding two hours, six shillings and eight-pence shall be allowed for each additional hour.

Certain English Rules as to Costs, adopted.

19. After the first day of March next, the General Orders of the High Court of Chancery in England, of the eighth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, respecting costs (and particularly the taxation of costs, the allowance of certain expenses in costs between party and party, the imposition or refusal of costs in case of matters of unnecessary length, and the fixing of a gross sum in certain cases in lieu of taxing costs), being numbers one hundred and twenty to one hundred and twenty-five, inclusively, shall be in force in all proceedings in equity in this court.

Attendance on Subpanas.

20. Every subpossa to testify, and subpossa duces teeum, shall require the attendance of the witness on a day to be specified therein, and thenceforth from day to day until the whole of the evidence in the cause shall have been taken, or he shall have been discharged by the Master from attendance.

Guardians ad litem.

21. When a Guardian ad litem is appointed, the presence of the Infant or Guardian in Court shall hereafter not be required.

Receivers empowered to let in certain cases.

22. Receivers of the rents and profits of land, now or hereafter appointed, shall, when the yearly rent of any such land shall not exceed fifty pounds, have power to let the land, subject to the approval of the Master, to be shown by his allocatur indorsed on the lease; and no proposal for a lease, or other proceeding relating thereto, (save the affixing of such allocatur) shall be had in the Master's Office without his direction. Provided that no such lease shall take effect till the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the allocatur; and that it shall be void if the Court shall make an order to that effect, at any time before the expiration of that term.

Petty Leases provided for.

23. Where the rent shall not exceed the rate of fifteen pounds yearly, Receivers shall have power to let the land from year to year, or for a less period, without the approbation of the Master previously signified; provided that every such case shall be subject to his control, as to future leases, in case of any complaint made to him.

#### No Report necessary.

24. In no case within either of the two last preceding Rules, shall any certificate or report be made, of the lease being granted or allowed; provided that the Master may in all cases direct such notices to be given of any proceeding under those Rules, as he may think fit.

Receivers may repair Property.

25. Every Receiver may, without the previous direction of the Master, lay out in repairing the property, when necessary, any sum not exceeding fifty pounds in one year; and the Master in passing his accounts shall allow the same, if he shall be of opinion that it has been expended for the benefit of the persons interested in the property.

#### EQUITY APPEALS.

Appeals as to Admissilihity of Evidence.

Prac. 301.

1. Where any order made by the Equity Judge, (under the 3rd rule of 2nd June, 1845,) shall hereafter be objected to, the same shall be appealed from separately; and the Appeal thereon shall be set down to be heard, on the first Friday in the next term, or on such earlier day as the Master shall appoint:—And the Appellant shall in every such case begin, and be entitled to a reply:—And no more than one Counsel shall be heard, on either side, (as to the admissibility of any one question, or piece of evidence,) without leave of the Court.

Appeals generally; Mode of Hearing.

2. On the hearing of all other Appeals in Equity, (whether on one point only, or on the whole case, or otherwise,) the party appealing shall begin.-Provided that, where it is necessary to open the pleadings, or to read the evidence, the same shall be opened and read, respectively, as on an original hearing .- And no more than two Counsel shall be heard, on either side, without leave of the Court, and one Counsel for the appellant in reply.

Setting down Appeals.

3. Every Appeal shall hereafter be set down, for the first day for the entering of Appeals in Equity, which shall happen next after the making of the deposit, or giving the security required by the Act, 11 Vict., No. 22; unless the Court, or the Primary Judge, shall otherwise order. And every Appeal not so entered shall be deemed to have been abandoned.

RULES NISI IN EQUITY.

Recital; 12 Vict., No. 1., s. 9. Whereas, by the Act passed in the twelfth year of the reign of Her Majesty, for simplifying and altering the law in some respects, a Rule Nisi is or may be in certain cases substituted for a Bill in Equity; and by the same Act power is given to the Judges to make rules for carrying that provision into effect. The several General Rules following are hereby established under that enactment, to come into operation on the first day of March next.

When Rule moved for.

1. Every motion for a Rule Nisi in Equity shall be made on some Wednesday only; and for the purposes of such motions, and all Rules and Orders thereon, the Court will sit in banco on every Wednesday on which the Judges, or any two of them, shall sit for taking matters in its insolvency jurisdiction.

Notice to Master.

2. Before any such motion, or any motion consequent on any such Rule Nisi, shall be made, reasonable notice of the party's intention to make the same shall be given to the Master in Equity; in order that he may attend the Court thereon.

Form, &c., of Rule. 3. Every such Rule, and all Orders thereon, shall be drawn or settled by the Master; or, in case of dispute, by a Judge: Provided that no

Rule Nisi shall hereafter contain any interrogatory, or shall require the Respondent to answer any interrogatory.

General Practice on Rules.

4. All other proceedings consequent on any such Rule shall also be commenced, and shall severally be carried on in the Master's office. And the same fees shall be payable in respect of any such Rule, Order, or other proceeding, as are or shall be payable in respect of analogous proceedings in the equitable jurisdiction of the Court.

Examination on Interrogatories.

5. Where, on the motion to make the Rule Nisi absolute, the Court shall direct the respondent to make discovery of any matters or matter, he shall be examined upon interrogatories, And every such to be left with the Master. examination shall be by the Master, in the presence of the parties, or such of them as shall think fit to attend, at such time and place as he shall appoint for that purpose.

Taking Evidence.

6. Where the Court shall, on the motion to make the Rule Nisi absolute, or afterwards, direct evidence to be taken, as to any matter or point in issue between the parties, the complainant may examine vivâ voce as a witness any respondent, and the respondent may examine the complainant or any correspondent. Provided that, whenever evidence shall be taken, the parties shall (as to every such matter or point) use such evidence exclusively.

Mode of proceeding thereon.

7. In every such case, an appointment shall be obtained from the Master, within eight days after the date of the Rule or Order in that behalf, fixing some day cortain, at his discretion, for the examination of witnesses on both sides; and if the complainant shall not obtain and serve due notice of such appointment, the respondents or any of them may within the next four days obtain a like appointment :---and, within four days after obtaining any such appointment, and four clear days at the least before the day appointed for the examination, notice thereof shall be served on every party entitled to attend thereon.

Powers of Master.

8. Every such examination shall be conducted in the same manner, and the Master shall in respect thereof have the same powers, as on the examination of witnesses before him in a suit of equity.

What to be deemed the Pleadings; and Prayer, &c.

9. The affidavits on which the Rule Nisi was obtained, and the affidavits or affidavit used in shewing cause, shall be taken to be the pleadings between the parties; and the Rule Nisi, the prayer of the complainant for discovery or relief. Provided that cause may be shown, without affidavit, by way of demurrer; and that, after such demurrer overruled, or after affidavits setting up any matter by way of plea, the Court may give leave, on such torms as it shall think just, to shew additional cause by affidavit .-- And, in like manner, on cause being shown, the Court may allow the complainant, on such terms as it shall think just, to file affidavits by way of amendment or reply.

#### Proceedings, &c. Title of.

10. All affidavits, rules, and pleadings, in respect of any Rule Nisi in equity, shall be indorsed with the words "In Equity. By Rule Nisi."-And the party moving for such Rule shall be termed the Complainant, and the party called on to show cause shall be termed the Respondent.
