PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the provisions of an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "*An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land,*" and in pursuance of the power delegated by Her Majesty, in that behalf, I did, by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Colony, appoint certain persons to be Members of the Legislative Council, by the said Act established, as more fully set forth in a Proclamation bearing date the eighth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and forty-eight; and whereas Edward Hamilton, Esquire, one of the persons named in such Letters Patent, hath, by a writing under his hand, addressed to me, resigned his seat in the said Legislative Council; Now, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, as such Governor aforesaid, do hereby proclaim that in pursuance of the authority in me vested, I have by Letters Patent, bearing even date herewith,

appointed Philip Parker King, Esquire, Captain in the Royal Navy, to be a Member of the said Legislative Council, in lieu of the said Edward Hamilton, Esquire, and until Her Majesty's pleasure shall be known.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this twenty-seventh day of May, in the thirteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty.

TRANSFERABLE AND REMITTABLE LAND AND

SEALED Tenders will be received at this Office until noon of Monday, the twenty-fourth of June, from persons desirous of advancing the whole or any portion of the Sum of Ten thousand pounds on the following security, and subject to the under-mentioned terms and conditions, viz. ---

(1.) Each tender must be for an even sum of hundreds of pounds, and must be endorsed "Tender for Debentures."

(2.) If the tender be accepted, Land and Immigration Debentures for £100 each, secured upon the Territorial Revenue of the Sydney or Middle District, will be issued for the sum advanced, and will bear interest at the rate of 3½d. per diem, or £4 18s. 10½d. per £100 per annum, payable half-yearly, on the first of January, and first of July.

FERRIES OVER THE RIVER PATERSON, ON THE ROAD LEADING TO HINTON FROM PATERSON; AT HINTON ACROSS THE RIVER HUNTER; AND AT PITNACREE, ALSO ACROSS THE RIVER HUNTER.
