PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a certain Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the Third year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled, "An Act for sub"jecting vessels coming to New South Wales, from " certain places, to the performance of Quarantine;" it was amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time as he may think fit and expedient, by any order or orders notified by Proclamation, to appoint certain stations or places within the harbour of Port Jackson, or within or near any other harbour or place within the said Colony, for the performance of Quarantine, under the said recited Act, where all vessels liable to Quarantine, and the crews, passengers and persons on board thereof, shall perform the same, and also, if necessary to appoint Lazarets and other places where the crews, passengers and other persons, and the goods, wares and merchandize, which shall or may be on board the said vessels, shall and may be detained and kept for the performance of Quarantine: Now, I, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, declare and order that the northern portion of Stradbroke Island, within or near the harbour or roadstead of Moreton Bay, which portion is "bounded on the east and north by the sea from a point due east of

" Mount Hutton to Amity Point at the south " entrance to Moreton Bay; on the west by the waters " of Moreton Bay, to a point about two miles south " of Canaipa, and due west of Mount Hutton; and "thence on the south by a line hearing due east to "the sea coast aforesaid," shall be a station and place for the performance of Quarantine, according to the several provisions of the said recited Act, and subject to the several rules, regulations, and restrictions contained therein, and in any order or orders which shall or may be made by me, with the advice of the Executive Council, concerning Quarantine and the prevention of infection; and I, do hereby strictly prohibit all persons, not being themselves under Quarantine, or duly authorised for the purposes of necessary communication with vessels under Quarantine or with the Quarantine ground, from going, under any pretence whatever, within the limits of the said northern portion of Stradbroke Island, as the same are hereinbefore described, when any ship or vessel is performing Quarantine thereat, or any persons, goods, wares, or merchandise are undergoing Quarantine on shore within the said limits, under the pains and penalties prescribed by law.

Given under my hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this Fifteenth day of July, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

HAM COMMON.—RICHMOND HILL.

THE description of the undermentioned portion of Land at Ham Common, in the parishes of Ham and St. Matthew, County of Cumberland, granted by His Excellency Governor King; in the year 1804, as a Common for the District of Richmond Hill, is published for general information.

At the expiration of one month from this date, the Deed of Grant of the said Common will be executed in favor of Messrs. George Bowman, William Cox, and Robert Fitzgerald, as Trustees appointed by His Excellency the Governor, under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council, 11th Vict., No. 31, initialed, "An Act to enable Trustees of Commons in New "South Wales, to have perpetual succession, and "to empower them to regulate the use of such "lands as may be granted as Commons within "the said Colony and for other purposes relating "thereto," viz.:—

41. CUMBERLAND, 6,006, Six thousand and six acres, parish of St. Matthew and Ham; bounded first on the south, (commencing at the west corner of D. M'Arty's 40 acres) by a line bearing west 12 degrees north to the village of Little Richmond, dividing it from various grants; then on the north-west by the south-east boundary line of the village of Little Richmond, bearing north 40 degrees east; then on the south-west by the north-east boundary line of that village, bearing north 50 degrees west; then on the south-east by the north-west boundary line of that village, bearing south 40 degrees west to the northern boundary line of Wm. Minchin's 200 acres; then again on the south by that boundary line bearing west 12 degrees north to Yellow Munday Lagoon; then on the west by Yellow Munday Lagoen to the southern corner of Charles Webb's 100 acres; then again on the north-west by Charles Webb's 100 acres, bearing north 54 degrees east to a reserved road; thence across that road to the south-east corner of Thos. M. Pitt's 100 acres; and thence by the following farms, bearing north 40 degrees east, viz .: Thos. M. Pitt's 100 acres, Mary Pitt's 100 acres, Thos. Spence's 100 acres, and William Small's 100 acres to the western corner of the township of Richmond; then on the north-east by the south-west boundary of that township, bearing east 40 degrees, south 81 chains 75 links; then again on the north-west by the south-east boundary of that town, bearing north 38 degrees 20 minutes, east 55 chains 27 links to the west side of Pagot-street; then on the northeast by a line bearing east 19 degrees, south 22 chains; then on the north-west by a line bearing north 19 degrees east to Richard Dalton's 100

lines of Richard Dalton's 100 acres, of Thomas Gordon's 100 acres, and of John Earl's 100 acres, bearing east 20 degrees north to the south-west corner of G. W. Evan's 519 acres; and thence by the southern boundaries of that land, of W. and J. Cox's 200 acres, and of Robert Forrester's 70 acres; then on the east by Wm. Naish's 180 acres bearing south; then on the north-east by Wm. Ezzy's 130 acres, bearing south 32 degrees east to the Glebe Land; then on the south-east by the Glebe Land, bearing west 37 degrees south; then again on the north-east by the Glebe Land, bearing east 40 degrees south; then again on the northwest by the Glebe Land, bearing north 34 degrees east to a point where the south-west boundary line of the Benevolent Asylum Land prolonged would meet the Glebe Land; then again on the north-east by a line to the west corner of the Benevolent Asylum Land; and thence by its south-west boundary line bearing east 33 degrees 30 minutes south; then again on the north-west by the south-east boundary line of that land, bearing north 33 degrees, 30 minutes east to the south-west Police boundary of the Town of Windsor; then again on the north-east by that Police boundary line bearing east 34 degrees south; then again on the north by the south Police boundary line of that town, bearing west to Thomas Cross' 30 acres; then again on the east by part of the west boundary line of that farm and by John Burn's 30 acres; then again on the south by part of Jacob Russell's 30 acres; then again on the east by Russell's land; then again on the north by part of that land to the north-west corner of Edward Johnston's 25 acres; then again on the north-east by Edward Johnston's 25 acres, and by Charles King's 30 acres, bearing south 20 degrees east; then by Rd. Ridge's 50 acres, and by J. Podgett's 30 acres, bearing south 28 degrees; then by 30 acres of land granted to Edward Perkins, in 1794, (but since cancelled;) then again on the south-east by Luars or Fremans' grant, bearing south-westerly; then again on the northeast by that grant, bearing south 30 degrees east to D. M'Arty's 40 acres; and then again on the south-east by D. M'Arty's 40 acres, bearing west 30 degrees south to the point of commencement.

THEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the night of the 18th ultimo, a stack of wheat, containing about two hundred bushels, the property of Richard Hawke; of Native Dog Creek, in the District of Hartley, was maliciously set on fire; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a reward of Twenty pounds, will be paid to any free person or persons, who may, within six months from the present date, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the party or parties guilty of the above outrage; and if the person giving such information, be a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to such prisoner of the Crown, of a Conditional Pardon.
