PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ Rov, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, passed in the sixth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to "provide for the division of the Colony of New " South Wales into Electoral Districts, and for " the Election of Members to serve in the Legis-" lative Council," provision was made for forming a Court for the trial of any complaints which might be made against the validity of any returns made by the Returning Officers of the several Electoral Districts created by the said Act; and whereas, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, a Court has been established for the purpose aforesaid, consisting of a President and four Members, nominated or elected, as in the said Act is directed; but it was by the said Act further provided, that the said Court should not proceed to any business, unless convened by order of the Governor: Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, as such Governor aforesaid, do hereby, in pursuance of the authority in me vested, summon and convene the said Court to meet, for the purpose aforesaid, at Eleven o'clock in

the forenoon of Thursday the twenty-fifth day of this present month of July, in the Council Chamber, in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney, and the President and Members of the said Court are hereby requested to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

By His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

Most Excellent Majesty in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, the Town and Port of Portland, within the District of Port Phillip, were declared to be a free Warehousing Port: And whereas it has been deemed expedient.

to establish a Port of Entry and Clearance at Port Fairy, within the limits of the said free Warehousing Port of Portland, as defined by the 56th section of the Act of Council, 9th Victoria, No. 15: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby order and direct that the said Port of Port Fairy, shall be a Port of Entry and Clearance, within the meaning of the above recited enactment.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

THEREAS by an Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the second year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, " An Act for regulating "the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, " Maitland, Bathurst, and other Townsrespectively, " and for the removing and preventing nuisances " and obstructions, and for the better alignment of "Streets therein," it was amongst other things enacted, that whenever the Governor or Acting Governor for the time being, should deem it expedient to extend the said Act to any other Towns in the said Colony, it should and might be lawful for the said Governor or Acting Governor for the time being, to declare the same by Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby direct that the provisions of the said Act, as amended by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the eleventh year of Her said Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act "for regulating the Police in the Towns of Parra-" matta, Windsor, Mailland, Bathurst, and other " Towns respectively, and for the removing and pre-" venting nuisances and obstructions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein," be extended to the Town of Singleton, in the County of Northumberland.
