## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight, Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to provide for the more effectual administration of justice in New South Wales and its Dependencies," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony, by Proclamation under his hand, issued and published from time to time, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same, to direct Circuit Courts to be holden in or at such towns or places within the Colony, as he should, by the advice aforesaid, think fit to appoint; and to fix from time to time, and vary or alter, as occasion may require, the times and places for holding the said Courts respectively; and whereas it is expedient that a Circuit Court should be held at the Town of Geelong, in the District of Port Phillip; Now, therefore I, the Governor aforesaid, by and with the advice of the said Executive Council, do hereby direct and appoint that a

Circuit Court for the trial of Criminal as well as Civil Issues shall be holden at the Town of Geelong aforesaid, and that during the year now next ensuing, and every following year until otherwise ordered, such Courts shall be holden in the months of February, June, and October, commencing on the twentieth day of each of such months, unless the same shall happen to fall on a Sunday, in which case the said Courts shall commence on the Monday next following.

Given under my hand and seal at Government House, Sydney, this sixth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and in the thirteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
