VACATED RUNS.

IT is hereby notified, that application having been made for the purchase of the leases of the runs of Crown lands hereunder described, which after having been occupied, have become vacant, Tenders, in the prescribed printed form, will be received at the office of His Honor the Superintendent, Port Phillip, until noon of Monday, the 6th day of August next, from the applicants and from any other persons desirous to enter into competition with them, for the purchase of the lease of the said runs.

2. Every such tender must state the term of years (not exceeding fourteen,) for which it is proposed to take the run, and whether in addition to the minimum rent required by Her Majesty's Order in Council, it is intended to offer any, and if any, what amount of yearly premium per thousand sheep, or equivalent number of cattle, for the lease.

3. As the grazing capabilities of the run have not yet been determined, it will be necessary that each tender contain an estimate of the number of sheep or cattle that the run will carry.

4. Until the run has been regularly surveyed and its grazing capabilities determined, the future lessee will be required to pay rent according to his own estimate, as given in his tender; and in the event of the rent so paid, proving to have been less than that determined by valuation, he will be required to make up the difference previously to the execution of the lease.

5. It is to be distinctly understood, that the Government reserves to itself the right of excluding from the lease of the run, any land which it may be deemed proper to reserve for any of the purposes referred to in the 9th section of Chapter II. of Her Majesty's Order in Council, dated 9th March, 1847.

6. Forms of tender can be obtained from the office of His Honor the Superintendent, Port Phillip, and also from the Crown Commissioners of the districts.

MURRAY DISTRICT.

2. AND IMMIGRATION DEBENTURES.

SEALED Tenders will be received at this Office, until noon of Monday, the twenty fourth of June, from persons desirous of advancing the whole or any portion of the sum of Ten thousand pounds on the following security, and subject to the undermentioned terms and conditions, viz:—

(1.) Each tender must be for an even sum of hundreds of pounds, and must be endorsed "Tenders for Debentures,"

(2.) If the tender be accepted, Land and Immigration debentures for £100 each, secured upon the Territorial Revenue of the Sydney or Middle District, will be issued for the sum advanced, and will bear interest at the rate of 3½d per diem, or £4 18s 10½d, per £100 per annum, payable half-yearly, on the first of January, and first of July.

(3.) They will be receivable as cash at any time for the purchase of Crown Lands in the Sydney District, or for any other payment due on account of the Territorial Revenue within the same.

(4.) (7.) The principal and interest of each Debenture will be payable at the option of the holder for the time being, either in Sydney or London; any change which it may be desired to make in this respect, being previously registered at the Colonial Treasury, in Sydney, and in the Office of the Colonial Agent-General, in London, and endorsed upon the Debenture, which must be presented accordingly at both these Offices for that purpose.

(8.) Whenever a debenture may be made payable in London, a Duplicate thereof will be transmitted by the Colonial Treasurer to the Colonial Agent-General by such opportunity as the holder may desire, in order that the same may be available on proof of the loss of the original.
