PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c.

WHEREAS by a certain Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the Third year of the reign of his late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for subjecting vessels coming to New South Wales, from certain places to the performance of Quarantine;" it was amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time as he may think fit and expedient, by any order or orders notified by proclamation, to appoint certain stations or places within the harbour of Port Jackson, or within or near any other harbour or place within the said colony for the performance of Quarantine, under the said recited Act, where all vessels liable to Quarantine, and the crews, passengers, and persons on board thereof shall perform the same, and also if necessary to

a point Lazarets, and other places, where the crews, passengers and other persons, and the goods wares and merchandise, which shall or may be on board the said vessels, shall and may be detained and kept for the performance of Quarantine: Now I, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, declare and order that the northern portion of Stradbroke Island, within or near the harbour or roadstead of Moreton Bay, which portion is "bounded on the east and north by the sea from a point due east of Mount Hutton to Amity Point, at the south entrance to Moreton Bay, on the west by the waters of Moreton Bay, to a point about two miles south of Cassipa, and due west of Mount Hutton; and thence on the south by a line bearing due east to the sea coast aforesaid, shall be a station and place for the performance of Quarantine, according to the several provisions of the said recited Act, and subject to the several rules, regulations and restrictions contained therein, and in any order or orders which shall or may be made by me, with the advice of the Executive Council, concerning Quarantine and the prevention of infection; and I do hereby strictly prohibit all

persons, not being themselves under quarantine or duly authorised for the purposes of necessary communication with vessels under Quarantine, or with the Quarantine ground, from going under any pretence whatever, within the limits of the said northern portion of Stradbroke Island, as the same are hereinbefore described, when any ship or vessel is performing Quarantine thereat, or any persons, goods, wares, or merchandise, are undergoing Quarantine on shores within the said limits, under the pains and penalties prescribed by law.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, passed in the sixth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to provide for the division of the Colony of New South Wales into Electoral Districts, and for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council," provision was made for forming a Court for the trial of any complaints which might be made against the validity of any returns made by the Returning Officers of the several Electoral Districts created by the said Act; and whereas, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, a Court has been established for the purpose aforesaid, consisting of a President and four Members, nominated or elected, as in the said Act is directed; but it was by the said Act further provided, that the said Court should not proceed to any business, unless convened by order of the Governor: Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, as such Governor aforesaid, do hereby, in pursuance of the authority in me vested,

summon and convene the said Court to meet, for the purpose aforesaid, at Eleven o'clock in the forenoon of Thursday the twenty-fifth day of this present month of July, in the Council Chamber, in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney, and the President and Members of the said Court are hereby requested to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Order of the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, the Town and Port of Portland, within the District of Port Phillip, were declared to be a free Warehousing Port: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to establish a Port of Entry and Clearance at Port Fairy, within the limits of the said free Warehousing Port of Portland, as defined by the 56th section of the Act of Council, 9th Victoria, No. 15: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby order and direct that the said Port of Port Fairy, shall be a Port of Entry and Clearance, within the meaning of the above recited enactment.

ROADS.

WITH reference to the Government notice dated 10th May last, relative to the opening and making a certain parish road from the Town of Geelong, in the County of Grant, through the County of Grenville, to the Township of Colac, in the County of Polworth, in the District of Port Phillip, notice is hereby given, in conformity with the Act of Council 4th William IV., No. 11, intitled, "An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof," that as no objections have been made, within the period allowed by law, to the line in question, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to confirm the said road, as already notified; and it is hereby declared expedient to open and make the said road according to the map or plan to be seen at the Office of the Surveyor General, in Sydney, and in that of the Surveyor in charge, at Melbourne; and all persons intending to claim compensation in respect of the said line, are hereby reminded, that notice must be served upon the Colonial Secretary, within forty days of the date hereof, in such manner and forms as are provided by the sixth and thirty-second sections of the Act above referred to, or they will be forever foreclosed from such claim.

PUBLIC NOTICE.

IN consequence of the frequent unlawful removal of Wood from the Crown Lands around Melbourne by woodcutters and others, it is considered desirable that public attention should be called to the fact that, by His Excellency's proclamation of the 5th July, 1849, all timber, either growing or dead, on the Crown Lands within the five mile boundary or limits hereunder defined, is strictly prohibited from being removed.
