## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "*An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies*," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that at Eleven o'clock of Wednesday, the 15th day of October next, the following Portions of Crown Land will be offered for sale by public auction, at the Police Office, Ipswich, Moreton Bay, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions and under the provisions of the above recited Act. Remarks—PM on right fore arm, strong made man, had on a white Guernsey frock with dark spots on it, light fustian trousers, cabbage-tree hat and brown scarf, dark waistcoat with metal buttons.

Remarks—Nose injured by disease or accident; had on when he escaped, a brown velvet shooting jacket, tweed vest, and moleskin trowsers.
