PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the authority vested in the Governor of New South Wales, by a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council thereof, passed in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the division of the Colony of New South Wales, after the separation of the District of Port Phillip therefrom, into Electoral Districts, and for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council,*" I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, as such Governor aforesaid, do hereby appoint that the Town of Richmond, in the County

of Cumberland, shall be a Polling place for the Electoral District of the Cumberland Boroughs, in addition to the several Polling places appointed for the said Electoral District, by the said recited Act.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this seventeenth day of September, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and in the fifteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
